Over Two Thousand Americans Became Canadian Citizens

OTTAWA, Wednesday.—The Secretary of State department reports that during the year and one half from July 1st 1906 to December 31st 1907, a number of aliens naturalized in Canada was 17,714. Of these 5,279 were from the United States; 2,217 were Russians, 2,060 were Japanese and 222 were Chinese.

WARSHIPS SAIL FROM QUEBEC

LARGE AMOUNT FOR R. R. WORK

Ontario Government to Borrow \$4,000,000 to Extend Railway to Grand Trunk Pacific.

MUCH ALREADY SPENT

(Special News Service)
TORONTO, Wednesday.—Hon. Col. Matheson, Treasurer, is planning a trip to England in October to float a loan of \$4,000,000 authority for which was given by the legislature at its last session, and of which the government have availed themselves to the extent of \$2,000,000 on treasury notes. Most of the money is for the extension of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario railway, which is now being built from Matheson to make connection with the Grand Trunk Pacific. For this work money has been taken from the general revenues of the province and when the loan is floated all the treasury notes given for advances will be redeemed.

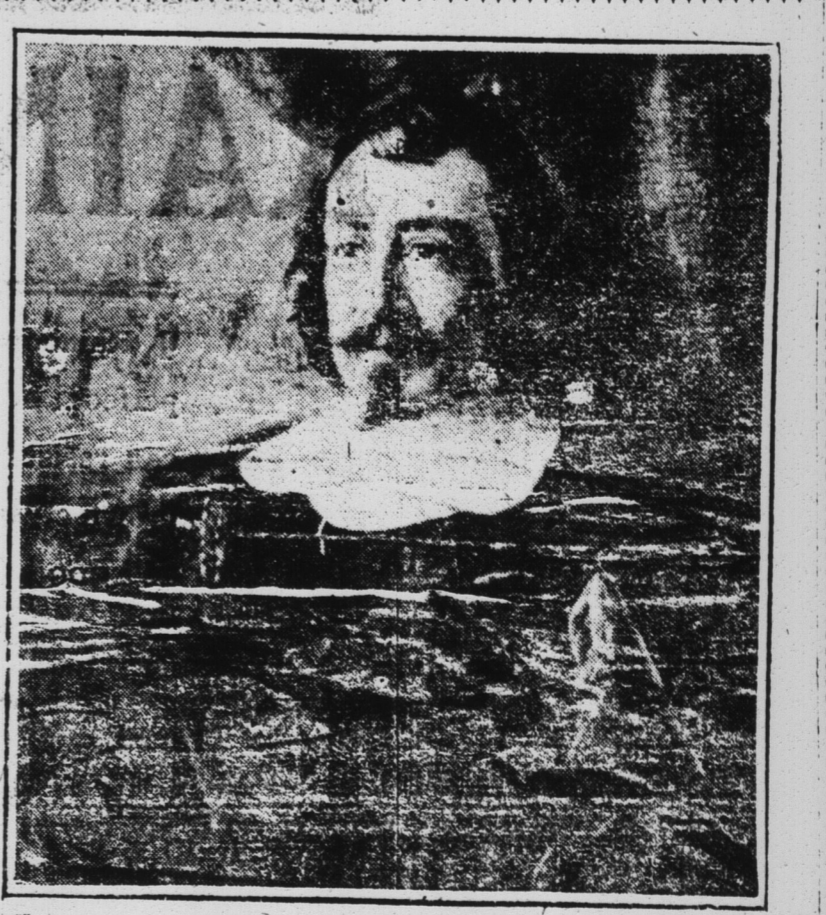
