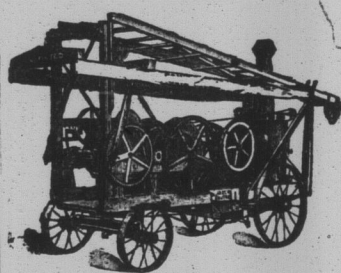

### Thomas A. Edison's Moulded Houses

It will be remembered that two years ago Mr. Edison announced himself to be engaged upon the problem of moulding concrete houses in one piece. Since that time the Wizard has been experimenting and at last declares the problem solved, the project worked out in detail. Many different plans have been drawn, patterns have been made, and a number of miniature models cast. The moulds for a full sized house are now in process of manufacture, and in a few weeks it is expected the first dwelling house will be cast. Mr. Edison claims that with the new moulds it will be possible to construct a first class house at a cost of only twelve hundred dollars, and only fourteen days will be required to complete the work. Such a house as planned will be two storeys high, with attic and cellar, and have a ground floor of twenty-five by thirty feet. On the first floor will be a living room, 14 by 23 feet. The second floor will contain two bedrooms fourteen by fifteen each, a large hall and a bathroom. The attic will contain two bedrooms, ten by fifteen. The cellar extending under the whole house will include boiler, washhouse and coal bunker. The entire structure, walls, roof, floors, stairways, partitions, door frames and window frames. Will be cast in one piece. Even the laundry tubs, the bath room fixtures, the interior decorations and the ornamental panels will be included in the solid shell. It is even claimed that the surface left by the moulds will be smooth enough to require no further finish except tinting or paper. In the building of a house, four days will be taken up in erecting the moulds, six hours for the hardening of the concrete, and the structure will be ready for occupants within a fortnight. The greatest difficulty in connection with the whole scheme was the making of a genuine concrete sufficiently fluid to flow into and fill up all the intricacies of the moulds and yet preserve a consistent density throughout. But inventive genius has apparently triumphed over all this and the experimental trials have been in every way successful. The method of pouring is quite simple. The concrete is mixed in large rotary mixers and poured into tanks placed on top of the moulds. A number of delivery pipes will lead to various points in the roof, where the mixture will flow down and fill all parts of the mould from the basement to the roof, and the deed is done. The moulds are of course very expensive the cost of the total outfit, six sets, being fully \$200,000, which makes it necessary for a firm with considerable capital to control the business. But if it proves the success anticipated, there will be little trouble in capitalizing the scheme, and even the workingman can then have a house of his own. The first test of moulding a full sized house will be awaited with interest.

### Canadian News in Brief

Ottawa.—Henry Lynch, who was mortally injured on the street car which was demolished when the Gillmor Hotel fell a few days after the big fire there two years ago, died on Saturday from his injuries.

Hull.—There is a possibility that a new industry will come to Hull, the United Soap Company, of Brandon, which says it is prepared to spend about \$60,000 on the erection of buildings.

Berlin.—Henry Cornel Hilborn, aged sixty-six, for many years a resident of Berlin, died here yesterday afternoon. Mr. Hilborn was the member of the firm of Clark Bros. & Co., Preston stove founders.

Ottawa.—Senator Katz, who is in the city, is inclined to view as a joke the action taken against him by A. Merner, of Alliston, for compensation in securing his appointment as Senator.

Pre-cott.—Miss Blanche Barcelo, aged thirty-three of Montreal, who was spending the summer with her sister-in-law, Mrs. Joseph Duhre, died suddenly Saturday of heart failure, brought on by acute indigestion while in bathing.

Ottawa.—Mr. R. H. McIlroy, M. L. A. for Carleton, will make a strenuous effort to put a stop to fast auto driving in the county. There have been several complaints recently especially from the vicinity of Britannia, regarding autoists exceeding the speed limit.

St. Catharines.—The organization was effected in this city of the Western Co-operative Fruit Company, whose object is to ship fruit from the Niagara fruit belt to the Canadian West direct from the producer to the consumer.

Hamilton, Ont.—G. Kirkendale farm laborer, employed by Geo. Smoke was struck by a train, while crossing the Grand Trunk yards. He was badly cut up and died on the way to the hospital.
