A GLORIOUS VICTORY IN KENT.

THE GOVERNMENT CANDIDATE ELECTED BY OVER 800 MAJORITY.

HE CARRIES EVERY PARISH IN THE COUNTY, BUT ONE, BY A HANDSOME VOTE.

Complete returns from the election Tuesday show that the defeat of the opposition candidate was the worst ever received by any one in Kent county. The vote was as follows:

Majority for Legere, 828. Butoche was the central point for the rejoicings of the friends of the government, who had a great demonstration Tuesday night. Attorney general Blair returned from Richibucto about 9 o'clock and met with an enthusiastic reception. Over 1,000 people had assembled from miles around. Bonfires blazed in many places. Early in the evening the member elect and Mr. J. A. McQueen, M. P. P. for Westmorland, arrived and addressed the electors. The latter made a point when he said that the French of Kent county had joined hands with the French of Westmorland and shaken off the old domination which had held them so long. On the arrival of premier Blair he was called on for a speech and thanked the electors for their confidence in the administration by sending a supporter to the assembly, and by such a decisive majority that there could be no mistake in their verdict.

Did you Notice it? 'Twas as if a veritable cyclone had fallen upon the opposition here when the result of the local election in Kent was made known on Tuesday night. All the leading spirits of the opposition of York gathered at the western union telegraph office, each one eager to be the first to receive the results of the glorious victory which had been proclaimed for the opposition candidate in Kent. It is true that the truthful Jimmy and the unquenchable George F. were not among the number, but that was accounted for to the eager questioners, as George F. had not returned from the precincts of the election, and Jim was "not in town." Perhaps the later was still at St. John whither he had gone for the purpose of telegraphing home the first results of the glorious victory and the beginning of the series of defeats which had been predicted for Blair. And as the little up-town daily intimates in a recent number that Gregory did not utter a sentence in Kent on any public platform, we shall be obliged to accept the utterances of that truthful paper, and put forth this supposition as the only alternative, that he simply went over to Kent on a pleasure excursion, and handled the boodle for the opposition.
