Has been Identified as Pickle Jones of Fredericton.

The Telegraph of the 29th, contained the following interesting bit of news: "Albert Shephard placed confidence in a newly found friend Monday, and thereby lost his savings of years. Shephard is an Englishman who has been working at St. John, and he lately decided to pay a visit to his native soil. He came to St. John via Fredericton, and intended going from here to Halifax to take the steamer for London. On the Fredericton steamer he became quite friendly with Fred H. Davis of the capital, and together they went to a boarding house on Union street. They slept together that night and yesterday morning before Shephard awoke his friend stole \$113 and a revolver from his pockets and departed. Shephard reported his loss to Chief Clarke yesterday morning and Detective King and Officer Greer soon learned that Davis had left on the morning train for the United States. A telegram giving a description of the thief was sent to Bangor, and on the arrival of the train there, he was arrested. Most of the money was found in his possession.
