LECTURE BY ARCHBISHOP LYNCH.

[From the Toronto Globe.]
His Grace occupied the pulpit in St. Michael's Cathedral yesterday evening, and commenced his discourse by remarking that old Catholics, like the fear of ghosts, float in the minds of some people, and even in mature years they can hardly get rid of them. Protestants ask a question which in fact has no foundation whatever, and to which he intended to show its utter fallacy. "Does not the Catholic Church suppress the second commandment?" "Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven thing or image." He replied that he agreed, both Protestants and Catholics, that the commandments are ten in number; but they do not agree in the division of them. The Catholics divided the commandments according to the sense or object of each. For instance, the first commandment concerns the worship of God; the second, the worship of man; the third, the worship of things; the fourth, the worship of parents; the fifth, the worship of the neighbor; the sixth, the worship of the neighbor's wife; the seventh, the worship of the neighbor's goods; the eighth, the worship of the neighbor's honor; the ninth, the worship of the neighbor's life; the tenth, the worship of the neighbor's property. IRISH NEWS.
