EXHIBITION CONCERNS.—Two grand concerts will be given in the new palace, Fredrickton, Exhibition week. Leading vocalists from St. John, Fredericton, Woodstock and other places in the province, are expected to take part.

THEFT.—While the row was going on, on Main street, Portland, Saturday night, \$1.25 was stolen from the counter of Mr. R. McConnell's store, by a sneak thief.

The annual competition of the York Co. Rifle Association, will take place Thursday, 26th inst., at the rifle range, Fredericton.

FOOT RACING.—On Saturday afternoon, McLatchey of Moncton, and Ward of Fredericton, ran 125 yards on the York Driving Park, Fredericton, for a purse of \$25. McLatchey was the winner.

The Seymour-Coff race did not take place at Gilbert's lane last evening, as was announced. Coff not agreeing to some of the conditions.

POISONING CASE.—The examination of Mrs. Elizabeth Burke, arrested on a charge of attempting to poison her husband some time since, was to take place before Justice Wornam of Moncton, yesterday afternoon.

RUNAWAY IN SHERBRO.—On Friday a span of horses being driven by R. A. Russell, Esq., of Sherbro, became frightened by a lopsided team and ran away. Mr. Russell control of the reins and the horses, who after running along the streets, dashed into the Sherbro station yard, crossing the platform and taking the railway track to the Point.

BASEBALL.—Last night at a meeting held in Mr. James Crawford's shop, Main street, Portland, the Invincibles were re-organized through the efforts of Capt. John Haley. They have decided to take part in the Exhibition Base Ball tournament, which commences in Fredericton, Oct. 17th, and which will last about five days.

ACCIDENT OF THE DORCHESTER PRISON.—A Dorchester correspondent of the Moncton Times writes:—Two men were seriously injured on the Provincial Penitentiary on Thursday. The steam derrick, after having raised to the top of the wall a load of planks and in letting it down into the building with more violence than they intended, struck a stage on which two carpenters, named McDougall and Penny, were working, sending them in the air some six feet, and on falling to the bottom McDougall jammed his head badly, breaking two bones and injuring himself less severe otherwise. Penny struck his head against the wall, cutting it somewhat, straining his back very much and got his thighs hurt by a plank falling across them. This is the first accident that has happened on the works since the beginning. Drs. Chandler and Hobb were immediately sent for and dressed up the wounds. They are both doing well.

INVESTIGATION.—It being reported that some of the firemen made away with some goods in the recent fire at Chaloner's drug store, an investigation of the matter will be held by the Chief Engineer to-morrow evening.

THIRD OF LIXE.—Fannie Warren, a young woman of about 18 years, who has lately been from the slums of Sheffield street, attempted to end her days by jumping into the water with the intention of drowning herself, at the break-water beach, Sunday evening. She was rescued by three young men and brought to a house a short distance away in an unbecoming state. After a time she revived and was soon on the road again. Before the occurrence she was staggering down the street, her appearance indicating that she had imbibed drugged liquor.

THE COMEDY COMPANY under the management of Mr. John E. Healey, are playing to large houses at St. John's, Newfoundland. They will remain there for a short time and then come to this city.

INQUEST.—Yesterday afternoon the inquest on the body of Thos. Farley who was killed on the 2nd, was resumed at the dead house. The testimony of Henry Buchanan was taken. He said that he found the body on the track in the vicinity of Gilbert's land, as he was going to work last Saturday morning. The deceased's head was lying on the rail. He did not then know who the man was. The coroner wanted the driver of the engine to give evidence, and as he was not present the inquest was adjourned until to-morrow afternoon at 3 o'clock.

UNRULY.—About eight o'clock last night a middle aged woman in a state of intoxication caused a great deal of noise on King street. Her language was of the vilest description. She held the attention of a large crowd for upwards of fifteen minutes before a policeman put in an appearance. She was afterwards marched to the Police Station.

ACCIDENT.—A young man named O'Brien met with a very severe accident in Messrs. Robinson and Ralston's shoe factory, being his left hand by being caught in the machinery.
