NO REDUCTION IN AUTO LICENCES BEFORE SEPT. 1

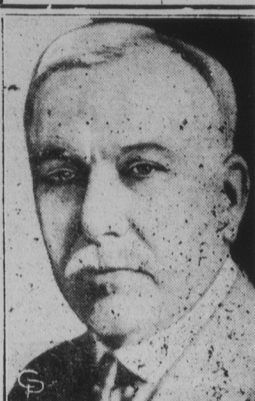
Fredericton, N. B. - Any hope that motor vehicle license fees in New Brunswick would be further reduced before Sept. 1 was dispelled tonight by Hon. D. A. Stewart, minister of public works.

During the last session of the Legislature the fee for passenger vehicles only was reduced five cents per hundredweight, from 90 to 85 cents. The minister's statement tonight was made to set at rest rumors which have been current for some days that there would be a further reduction before the end of August.
