The People's Bank of Halifax has opened an agency at Shediac, N. B. Hoegg's canning factory put up 70,000 cans of corn during the season just ended.

The N. S. C. Railway is now a continuous line from Middleton to Bridgewater. Some ballasting remains to be done before it is opened for traffic.

From January to the end of December 24,822 emigrants have arrived at Montreal by water and rail, and those arriving since last March have brought \$270,000 with them.

—Says the Halifax Chronicle: Three pieces of gold quartz of extraordinary richness, just as they came out of the blast, were brought to the city on Saturday from the Amundson mine at Montague.
