

WATCH WOOD BISON HERD

Two Employes of the Forestry Bureau to Spend Years at Great Slave River.

Ottawa, June 5—With the object of preserving to Canada the last herd of wood bison in the world, two employes of the forestry branch of the department of the interior are being sent on a mission to the banks of the Great Slave river, over 500 miles north of Edmonton. They will remain there for some years, and their sole duties will be to see that the herd multiplies without outside disturbance.

The herd of wood bison numbers from 150 to 300, an exact count being impossible on account of the wooded country in which they live. They are heavier and darker than the plain bison and as stated are the last of their species. Their chief enemies are the wolves, and at times the Indians are known to molest them.
