Scott Act on North Shore

(Chatham Commercial.)

It cannot be denied that since the present Town Council took office the number of drunken men to be found on our streets has increased to a deplorable extent. At a meeting of the Sons of Temperance, last Friday, Mayor Byrne spoke of "the difficulties, both internal and external, in the successful enforcement of the Scott Act by the Town Council." With all respect due to His Worship, we have no hesitation in characterizing this as all moonshine. There are no difficulties at all in enforcing the Act, even in a "common sense" way, by a Council which is determined on the matter. At the present time, there is no pretence whatever being made; matters are simply being allowed to drift on their own way. The various "dives" are at present flourishing as they never flourished before, absolutely unheeded and unchecked. The present council came into power on a promise to give a proper enforcement of the Act, tempered it is true, with reasonable discretion in the case of hotels. As things are, there is no discretion whatever being exercised; liquor is being sold as freely and openly as dry goods and groceries, under the very noses of the police. What is the police committee doing? Are they willingly blind?


