**N. B. WOMAN
FOURTH WIFE**

Veteran of Civil War Gets a
Bride Who Never
Quarrelled,

Boston, July 18—A fourth trial at matrimony will be made by Andrew J. Barnard, 68 years old and a civil war veteran of 8 Allston place, when he weds Mrs. Elizabeth Johnson, 62 years old, of Lent Mountain, N. B., a widow.

The couple took out a marriage license at the Boston City Hall yesterday afternoon.

Two of Barnard's wives died after many years of married life. The third he divorced when he learned she had a husband looking for her in the West. The woman who is to be his wife No. 4 is a widow whose husband on his deathbed said that she had never quarrelled with him during the 28 years of their marriage.

Barnard, who is superintendent of the machine setting-up department of the Lunt-Morse Company, of this city, has been living alone for 11 years in the West End. He says he wants a cheerful companion to free his declining years from lonesomeness.

Mrs. Johnson is the mother of four sons and three daughters. She met Barnard nearly two years ago, and during the last year they have courted as formally as couples one-quarter their age. She had been a professional housekeeper and nurse in Boston.

Barnard is the owner of fifteen farms in western Massachusetts. His bride-to-be has considerable money distributed among New Brunswick savings banks. They say they are marrying purely for love and that money is no consideration.

In the battle of Fredericksburg Barnard was shot in the head and the scar still remains. At Gettysburg his arm was nearly severed by a Confederate sabre.
