Young Lad Killed by I. C. R. Train

New Glasgow, Nov. 8.—A serious accident happened on Saturday at noon on the second railway crossing below Trenton as a result of which Grantie Murray, a fifteen-year-old son of T. P. Murray, of Egypt, died at Aberdeen Hospital from injuries, and a second lad named McGillivray lies seriously hurt in the same institution. The boys were proceeding to their homes from Trenton and were getting a lift on the rear of a farmer's wagon. In taking the railway crossing they failed to notice the approach of a freight train. In the hurry to get the wagon clear of the rails the boys either accidentally fell off or jumped off to avoid the train and were caught before they could get clear.

BOY BROKER GETS 5-YEAR SENTENCE
