Rev. R. H. Stanger organized a division of the Sons of Temperance at Chatham last week. There are about 50 members in the new division. Those elected to office were:

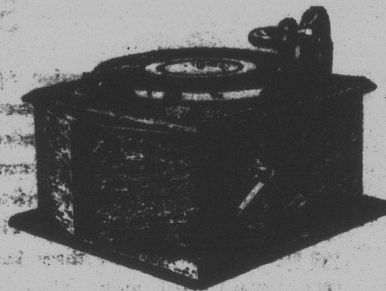
