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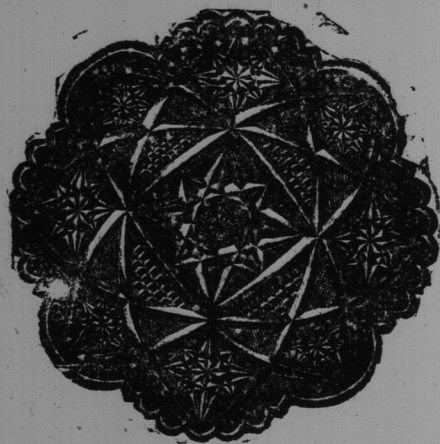

Eggs With Green Peppers—For four or five people allow six eggs. Toast as many slices of bread as there are persons to be served and put where it will keep hot. Put a teaspoonful of butter in a frying-pan, and while it is heating break the eggs into a bowl. Allow a tablespoonful of milk or water to each egg, and as soon as the butter is melted and begins to bubble, turn the eggs and milk or water mixture in. When the whites begin to set, lift and stir with a silver fork. In readiness two finely chopped sweet green peppers, from which all the seeds have been removed, and as the egg begins to cook stir the peppers through the mixture. Cook just a moment, spread on hot toast and serve immediately.

Egg Nest—Beat the white of a new laid egg to a stiff froth and heap on a piece of toast. Make an indentation like a nest in the centre, drop the yolk in that, slip in the oven and let remain two or three minutes until the egg is set. Season with salt and pepper and put a tiny bit of butter on each egg.

MRS. BAILEY'S DEFENCE.

Flatly Denies the Evidence of F. A. Dykeman Accusing Her of Theft—Jurors Fined.

The trial of Mrs. Jacob Bailey, of Cedar street, North End, charged with stealing a piece of silk in the store of F. A. Dykeman, Charlotte street, on May 21st, was taken up this morning in the circuit court. Owing to the absence of some of the jurors the trial did not begin till after eleven o'clock. Judge McLeod instructed the sheriff to summon talesmen, six of whom responded, and the trial proceeded. The absent jurors are to be fined.

Hon. H. A. McKeown is prosecuting and the accused is defended by Scott E. Morrell.

F. A. Dykeman was the first witness. He said that about 3.30 o'clock on the evening of the 21st of May, the accused entered his store and approached a witness, who was standing at the front counter on the left, not far from the entrance. Accused asked to see some black silk, which was shown to her. She purchased a piece of the silk, valued at 25 cents. Witness returned her some change and in the parcel which he handed her he rolled up the bill, a practice followed at his store. He then returned to the shelf the roll of black silk. As he was turning round he noticed that the accused had moved some six feet along the counter to where there was a pile of silks, and that she appeared to be agitated. He saw that she was putting something into her bag and incidentally noticed that a piece of silk was missing. Going outside the counter he took her bag and withdrew from it the piece of missing silk. Accused offered to pay for it, but he said he thought he would have to call the police. She said: "Oh, don't do that, Mr. Dykeman, it will disgrace me. I'll pay for the silk." In the meantime, the police arrived. She gave her name as Daley, at an address which witness could not remember. To the officers she had her own name, but when pressed changed it to Bailey, on Cedar street.

Mr. Dykeman was subjected to a severe cross-examination. He, however, stuck closely to his story. Officer Lee swore that the accused first gave her name to him as Daley. Sergeant Caples' evidence was about the same.

The first witness for the defence was Jacob H. Bailey, husband of the accused. He told of buying just this morning at F. A. Dykeman's store a piece of factory cotton and of receiving the bill not rolled up in the parcel but separate.

Mrs. Caroline McLeod swore also to making a purchase at the Dykeman store and of receiving the bill separated from the parcel.

The last witness was the accused, Mrs. Bailey. She flatly contradicted Mr. Dykeman's story in all its essential particulars. The first she knew of anything was wrong was when Mr. Dykeman sharply questioned: "What have you got in that bag?" Upon replying that she had her own goods, he said: "You are a liar." He then took the bag from her. She gave her name as Bailey both to Mr. Dykeman and the police officers. Mr. Dykeman treated her rather roughly and before leaving the store said to her: "Remember, sir, when you're done with me, I'm going to deal with you." The cross-examination of the accused is going on this afternoon, and in all probability the case will go to the jury before adjournment.

NO BISHOP CHOSEN.

Archdeacon Kauback is to name a committee consisting of ten laymen and ten clergymen to inquire into the names of candidates and report at the synod meeting in August.

KUROPATKIN TAKES THE OFFENSIVE AT LAST

Is Attacking General Oku's Forces—Admiral Togo's Graphic Description of the Recent Victory at Port Arthur.

ON THE VERGE OF BATTLE.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 27, 11 a. m.—Despatches received here from T. T. Cho indicate that both the Russian and Japanese armies are moving into contact for a great battle, which even now may be in progress. General Kuropatkin yesterday assumed the offensive against General Oku, while General Kurold from a position four miles to the eastward was moving against the Russian flank at Hai Chen.

THE BATTLE AT PORT ARTHUR.

OKIO, June 26.—Delayed in transmission—Admiral Togo's detailed report of his effective attack on Port Arthur last Thursday night reached Tokyo today. The report confirms the reported destruction of a Russian battleship of the Peresviet type, the disabling of a protected cruiser resembling the Diana, and the injury of a torpedo destroyer, but throws no light on the Russian plan. The entire Russian fleet stands out to sea, and the Russian fleet, suddenly within fourteen thousand metres from the Japanese fleet, the Russian fleet refused to give up the harbor on Friday, since which time it has failed to respond. In his report Admiral Togo says: The exit of the Russian fleet from Port Arthur harbor began Thursday. The battleships Peresviet, Poliva and Sevastopol, the armoured cruiser Bayan, the protected cruisers Palada, Diana, Askold and Novik came first. A warning flashed by wireless telegraph by which time it has failed to respond. 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
