SMOKING ON THE STREET IS AGAINST THE LAW.

But Fortunately the Law is Not Enforced—St. John Has Many Such Dead Letter Enactments.

SMOKING ON THE STREET IS AGAINST THE LAW.

This city has never lacked by-laws regulating the conduct of its inhabitants.

Many of the civic ordinances, however, have become obsolete, while others are practically dead letters and seldom, if ever, enforced.

Another by-law which is honored more in the breach than the observance is that relating to the dumping of coal and fire-wood upon the sidewalk.

European cities are not ahead of St. John in having a law forbidding the throwing of paper and other light refuse on the streets.

It is possible to enumerate almost indefinitely dead letter civic by-laws. Many of them, of course, will remain unenforced unless a large number of them are enforced.

STRUCK A REEF.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 7.—The merchants' exchange has received a cable from London stating that the steamer "Petrovsk," on her way from London to San Francisco, struck a reef off the coast of Alaska.

The officers and crew were rescued and taken to Hokodate, Japan, by the Japanese steamer "Mitsushima."

The vessel was valued at between \$150,000 and \$200,000 and was insured for \$100,000.

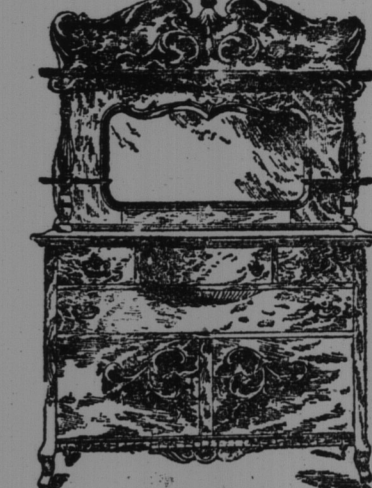
