LONDON, Nov. 5.—According to information from the Island of Perim, at the entrance to the Red Sea, an investigation of Massira Island, made by the Sultan of Muscat, shows that 20 British crew, comprising the captain and twenty-one men which left the British steamship Baron Inverdale, which ran ashore at the Kuria Muria Islands, reached Massira Island and were massacred by the natives there.
