A VICTORY FOR REFORM.

The appointment of M. Witte to Count Muraviev's place at the head of the Russian peace plenipotentiaries is a victory not only for peace but for reform generally.

M. Witte is the most prominent of the moderate Liberals and altogether one of the sanest statesmen Russia has ever had.

His appointment is a victory not only for peace but for reform generally.

The sudden supplanting of this leading representative of the autocratic party by the leader of the reformers means more than the alleged sickness of Muraviev, more even than that the

Czar believes Witte is better fitted to make good peace terms for Russia—than the revolutionary sentiment of the Liberals and the loss of power of the bureaucrats.

The Ottawa Journal advises the placing of a time limit on parliamentary speeches or, as it puts it: "the application of an intelligent system of limitation of the periods of debate."

A highly sensible suggestion to which we fall to see a single sensible objection. All agree that parliament is sitting too long, that a great deal of time, which means money there as elsewhere, is lavishly wasted.

The present parliament has been sitting six months. At least half of the occupied time has been spent in wholly unprofitable talk—and half is a very conservative estimate.

What harm would be done the country if all this useless yapping were cut out altogether? Some of the politicians might fill up and choke to death perhaps but that would not be an unmitigated evil.

Of course there are difficulties in the way. There are times when a long speech is fitting and occasionally necessary and a hard and fast time limit rule might once in a while prove a hardship.

But the London incident is not of the same class as that in which United States Collector Bump figured.

The latter in his official capacity ordered a Canadian captain to haul down the flag on his own ship where it had the right to be.

No national apology is called for by the London incident, which was an official proceeding, but the orderly members of the Michigan excursion would probably be informed that the trampling under foot of the Stars and Stripes is not approved in this country.

The federal official on Lake Ontario who refused clearance papers to a Canadian captain until the latter hauled down the British flag he was flying on the Fourth of July, should be publicly reprimanded. Foreign ships are foreign

property and their right to fly their own flags while in an American port is, or should be, at all times unchallenged and unchallengeable.
