ELMER YOUNG, CRITIC.

Mr. Elmer Young, father of the child who was murdered at Digby and of the one who would have been killed had the murderer been successful, is not satisfied with Nova Scotia Justice.

"Talk about speedy trials and quick decisions of juries," he exclaimed to the Boston American's correspondent.

"Why, what would they think in the United States if a jury to try a murder case was impaneled in an hour, and after hearing circumstantial evidence of the most precarious nature came to a unanimous decision inside of another hour?"

"I have been a detective for years and have been identified with many legal actions, yet I never saw anything that sailed under the name of Justice conducted as this trial has been."

On questions of justice and of decency Mr. Elmer Young would perhaps not be regarded as the highest authority, either in Boston or Digby.

The complaint that a Digby jury was empaneled in one hour, and that less than two days' trial, will likely give Boston some respect for Nova Scotia Justice.

In some notable United States trials many days were spent in obtaining a jury, while weeks passed in hearing expert and other evidence and in the wrangling of counsel.

Under similar circumstances the people in the United States would probably think that the jury was right. It was not for the jurors to say whether the intellectual capacity of the girl was such as to release her from some part of the responsibility.

Meanwhile it might be well for Mr. Elmer Young to ask what the people of his own neighborhood think of him, should he ever come to this country on his own best showing, about the meanest possible type of man.

A QUESTION OF MONEY. If the negotiations between Russia and Japan fall because Russia will not pay money and Japan will not make peace without it, the outcome will be a sort of diplomatic triumph for Russia.

In diplomacy Russia is astonishingly clever, and it will be a notable achievement to have used President Roosevelt to place Japan in a false position.

Had Japan insisted to the end that the whole of Sakhalin must remain Japanese, contending that this was only a restoration of property, and that the possession was necessary to Japan's future safety, there would have been no want of dignity in that position.

Or if the final issue had turned upon the limitation of the Russian fleet in eastern waters, this also could have supported on high grounds. But to make the refusal of peace a matter of cash is inconvenient.

To be sure it may be said that Russia's refusal is also a matter of money. But the refusal to pay tribute may be a matter of national honor, while the insistence of the payment of the ransom has no such defence.
