SERMON TO YOUNG MEN.

Rev. D. Hutchinson Delivers Able Address in Main St. Baptist Church—Second of Series.

The second of his series of sermons to young men was preached last evening by the Rev. D. Hutchinson in the Main St. Baptist church. The large auditorium was filled to the doors. An interesting feature of this series of sermons to young men is the male choir. During the service several beautiful selections of music were rendered in a way which reflected great credit on Mr. Holder, and the young men composing his male choir.

The subject of the sermon was: The Young Man and His Companions. The text was from Proverbs chap. 4: 14: Enter not into the path of the wicked, and go not in the way of evil men. In his introduction, the preacher showed that in the moral nature of things companionship is bound to be either helpful or harmful, a blessing or a curse. He told of a large number of Boston merchants who replying to an inquiry addressed to them by Rev. F. Clarke declared that in their opinion "the evil influence of bad companions was the greatest enemy of the youth of the country."

Answering the question what is the test of a good and true companion, the preacher said that a wise and safe companion was characterized by four things. He would command respect, inspire confidence, hold back from things that were wrong, and arouse one to be good and to do good. Each point was set forth by apt illustration. The young men were faithfully warned against choosing for companions those who were loose in their words, who scoffed at religion and things sacred, who were given to extravagant living, and those who lacked any pleasure.

The sermon was closed with an earnest appeal for all young men present to choose for their constant and closest companion Jesus Christ. He would safeguard them in the hour of temptation, help them in their seasons of trial, guide them in all times of perplexity, and stand by them in the most solemn crises of life.

THE SAYRE CASE

John Sayre Assigns and Goes Free—Andrew Doyle and His Wife United.

HAMPTON, Kings Co., Oct. 21.—At noon today Commissioner G. O. Dickson City delivered his judgment in the case of John Sayre of Sussex, who has been making a disclosure of his affairs with a view to secure his discharge from jail, where he has been held since the 18th instant as a debtor under capias by Vassie & Co., Ltd., of St. John. Before delivery of judgment F. M. Sprull said that after consultation with Mr. Jones, defendant's counsel, and the defendant himself, they had agreed to make an assignment under the act to Sheriff F. W. Fessie of all John Sayre's estate and effects for the benefit of all his creditors, provided it were done without cost to himself, he being entirely "without money means." The assignment was drawn up and carried out such assignment, and with the turning over of the property, the defendant's consideration that he should be entirely free from arrest on account of his indebtedness to any other creditor. Charles Hamilton of the firm of Hamilton, Tweed & Hamilton, accepted the proposal on behalf of the plaintiffs, and within fifteen minutes the legal document was drawn up, signed and duly attested, and an order made for the young man's discharge from custody.

This morning, Andrew Doyle, the man convicted of vagrancy and wife-beating, and committed to jail until he should pay the costs of the suits brought against him, managed to raise the requisite \$15, and was set out of jail and down to his place of residence, accompanied by his wife, both looking as happy as two children going to a party.

FOUGHT BATTLE WITH PISTOLS.

Three Men Terrify Passengers on New York Street Car—Combatants Seriously Injured.

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Three men fought a battle with pistols on an Eighth avenue car today, in the course of which all of them were seriously injured. While the fight was being waged the car ran at top speed for half a mile, with the guns sounding an alarm and the passengers lying flat on the floor to escape the shower of bullets.

Thomas O'Brien, a truckman, jumped aboard the car at Thirty-first street and clapped a revolver in the conductor's hand, ordered him to rim the car full speed, as he was pursued by a gang who intended to kill him. A moment later two more men leaped on the car and attacked the first, all three using revolvers. When their weapons were empty they clinched and fought with the butts of their pistols.

The motorman pounded the conductor shouting for the police, as far as Twenty-sixth street, where several policemen blocked it and secured the three combatants, all of whom were too badly injured to offer any resistance.

O'Brien was found to have received a bullet in the neck. His assailants gave the names Henry Francis and Thomas Sullivan. The former had been shot in the neck and the latter in the leg and arm. All three were taken to a hospital.

SAD DEATH OF CHATHAM MAN

CHATHAM, Oct. 21.—William Purcell, an employe of the Montreal Pulp and Paper Company, was killed this morning near the mills of the company, having been run down by a locomotive of the concern. The locomotive is used for conveying the cars of wood from the backing mill to the factory, and runs upon rails laid upon St. Andrew's street.

The unfortunate man appears to have been bewildered, and evidently did not hear the whistle of the locomotive, as the factory whistle is said to have been blowing at the same time. Driver Bernard Boyle, who was running the engine, did all in his power to stop it, but was unable to do so before he fell, but was unable to do so before he fell into safety.

Purcell was a steady, hard industrious, and a good citizen. He was about fifty-nine years old, and leaves a wife and two children, who have the sympathy of the community in their sad bereavement.

TOGO REPORTS TO THE EMPEROR.

TOKIO, Oct. 22.—Today was made memorable in the annals of Japan by the public entry of Admiral Togo, who came to report to the emperor the return of his fleet from the war.

The distinguished naval officer arrived at the Shimbashi station at 10.30 a. m. He was met by ministers of state, a warm welcome to the captain of the diplomatic corps and hundreds of officials and private citizens, who extended him a warm welcome to the captain, admiral, mirals Katakao, Kato and others, and saluted with their respective staffs.

The party entered five imperial carriages placed at the disposal of the emperor's majesty's aide, Admiral Inouye, drove direct to the palace, reaching there at 11 o'clock, when they were received in audience by the emperor.

Admiral Togo's carriage, escorted by a bodyguard of troopers, passed through a triumphal arch in front of the railway station. The streets were lined with an admiring crowd, who shouted hearty huzzas as the party passed along.

General Sakuma detailed three battalions of guards of honor. The battalions were composed of men from the public entry of Admiral Togo, and were under command of Major General Togo. Four guns located at Hibuya park, fired salutes. The day was a beautiful one, and all Tokio was out to welcome the victor of the battle of the Sea of Japan.

WILL REFUSE OFFER

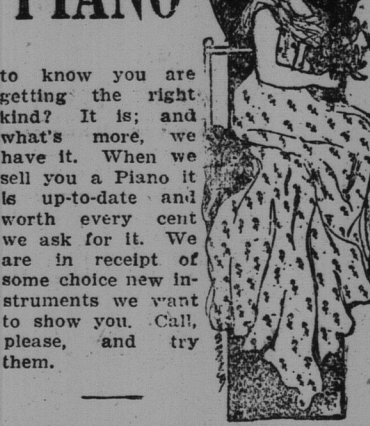
