

unprincipled ruffians to consummate their villany, one can scarcely wonder that it should be so. As regards the accomplishment of their professed designs on Canada, no one, we believe, entertains the remotest fear; but that they may harass and do infinite mischief on our frontier, and keep up a state of fevered suspense, and even endanger peace between the two nations, is too evident. It is certainly a matter of surprise that the U. S. Government have not acted with more decision, and almost warrants the belief that they are not averse to see Great Britain embarrassed and put to expense. Whether they are willing to involve the two countries in a wicked and destructive war, which, whatever harm it may inflict on us, would assuredly aid in doubling their own immense national debt, to say nothing of the destruction of life and property that must ensue, is another question. We were pleased to see the *Examiner*, the leading Baptist paper in New York, express so decided an opinion in the matter, and they by no means exculpate their own Government from culpable negligence in the course they have pursued in regard to it. In winking at such an organization as that of the Fenians, within the bounds of their own territories, they are undoubtedly fostering a spirit which may one day react upon themselves. No Government can afford to let its own subjects transgress and condemn its laws, or outrage those of other nations, with impunity. Even if their neighbours are too weak or too pusillanimous to redress the wrong, vengeance will do its own work among themselves. It is as yet uncertain how the Canadian Government will deal with the Fenian prisoners taken at Erie. That condign punishment ought to be inflicted on the leading pirates is not a matter of doubt. Their objects were robbery and murder, the last of which crimes they have succeeded in committing. There can be no valid reason for distinguishing their case from that of other murderers.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Four new Lighthouses erected during the summer in this Province, undermentioned and described, are now and will be in operation from this date until further notice:

The Lighthouse on Flint Island, on the eastern coast of the Island of Cape Breton, on the right of the former light-house, in lat. 46deg. 11min. 5sec. N., lon. 59 deg. 47min. W.; exhibits a Revolving Light 65 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every fifteen seconds. The building is octagonal in form, painted white, and is forty-three feet high from base to vane.

The Lighthouse on Green Island, near the south-east end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat, Cape Breton Island, in lat. 45deg. 28min. 51sec. N., lon. 60deg. 52min. 40sec. W.; is situated on the summit of the Island, and exhibits a Fixed Light, elevated 70 feet above high water. The Lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Height from base of dwelling to top of lantern, 31 feet.

The Lighthouse on Egg Island, on the south-east coast of this Province, in lat. 44deg. 39min. 51sec. N., lon. 62deg. 51min. 32sec. W.; is situated nearly on the centre of the Island, and exhibits a Revolving Light 85 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. The Lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Height from base of dwelling to top of lantern, 31 feet.

The Lighthouse on Little Hope Island, on the south-east coast of this Province, in lat. 43deg. 48min. 31sec. N., lon. 64deg. 47min. 15sec. W.; is situated nearly in the centre of this Island, and exhibits a Revolving Red Light, elevated 40 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. The Lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Height from base of dwelling to top of lantern, 31 feet.
