Miscellaneous.

The Southern negro preachers are generally credited with speaking out what they believe. They come to the point without much circumlocution. When ye gits to de golden gate an' Peter looks you right in de eye and yer shows him yer long creed and says, pompous like, dat yer 'longed to de big 'Piscopalian Church, de 'postle 'll shake his head an' say, 'Dat aint nuff to get yer through.' But if yer takes all yer bills under yer arm, yer grocer an' yer rent bills, an' he looks 'em all over an' finds 'em all receipted, he'll say, 'Yer title's clear,' an' unlock de gate an' let yer pitch yer voice for de angels' song. But it aint no use ter trubble along dat narrer path 'less yer can carry, folded up in yer creed, a good rec'ommendation from your creditors. Hebben aint no place for a man who has to dodge round a corner for fear of meeting someone who'll ask 'for dat little bill dat never was paid.'"

Some curious figures bearing upon the subject of capital punishment, and with special reference to the frequency of the crime of murder in the canton of Fribourg, Switzerland, before and since the abolition of the death penalty, have been published. In this canton there were only seven cases of murder in the ten years between 1804 and 1874. In the latter year the punishment of death was abolished. During the next three years fifteen murders were committed in the canton, while this year alone there have been five cases of homicide.

A good hint to hypercritics may be found here;—Dr. Willet, lecturing in Boston recently, told a droll story of himself. He said that at one time, when he was a connoisseur in bird-stuffing, he used to criticise other people's bird-stuffing, severely. John Osbrook was arrested at Indianapolis, Dec. 18, for stealing an overcoat of his employer, Knox a South Illinois street barber. The *Evening News* tells the following strange story connected with the arrest:

"Knox is a firm believer in the Bible as a means of detecting crime and criminals, and put it in use in this instance. His mode of operation is this: Taking a long key he places it between the leaves an inch or two. A string is then tied about the book so that it may be held by the key. Two persons each put a finger under the shoulder of the ring of the key; the words of Ruth to Naomi saying that she will not leave her, are repeated, and, and the name of some person is spoken. If it be that of a guilty party the Bible will voluntarily turn about and fall to the floor; if he is innocent there will be no motion. Knox called in Captain Campbell and Officer Splann, and went through the formula described, calling the names of half a dozen persons. There was no response by the book till Osbrook's name was given (Knox had suspected him), when it slowly turned and fell. Osbrook was conscience-stricken, and at once confessed to the theft. With fifty cents he redeemed the coat, which had been pawned, and was then arrested. He pleaded guilty, and was sent to the Grand Jury.

STEAM COMMUNICATION with the Magdalen Islands.

Tenders for Fortnightly Mail Service.

TENDERS, addressed to the Postmaster-General, will be received at Ottawa, until noon on, **FRIDAY, the 11th April next,** for the conveyance of Her Majesty's mails by steamer, once a fortnight each way, during the season of navigation, between Pictou, N. S., and the Magdalen Islands, under a proposed contract for three years, commencing with the opening of navigation in 1879.

The steamer employed in this service is to call at Georgetown on each trip, both going to and coming from the Magdalen Islands. The steamer will also be required to remain one day at the Islands, and while there to carry the mails from Amherst Island to Grindstone Island and back.

The tenders to give a full description of the steamer offered for the service, specifying the tonnage, speed, and accommodation for passengers and freight; and also the price asked for each round trip to the Islands and back over the above described route.

Further information as to the conditions of the proposed contract may be obtained at the office of the subscriber.

Tenders for Weekly Mail Service.

Separate tenders will be received by the Postmaster-General on the same date for a weekly steam service between Pictou and the Magdalen Islands via the same route, and on the same conditions, otherwise, as those of the proposed contract for a fortnightly service.

It will, however, be an additional stipulation of the proposed weekly contract that one trip per month shall be made to and from GASPE BASIN or PERCE instead of Pictou, should the Postmaster-General require it.

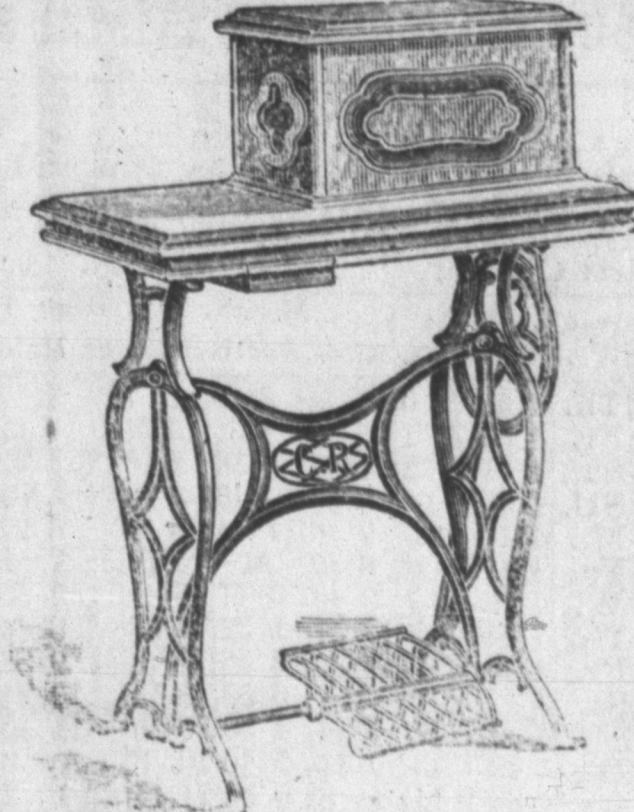
