### DISTRICT REPORTS.

THE FIRST DISTRICT held its Annual Meeting this Conference. #### A MAN IN THE FALLS OF NIAGARA.

The Buffalo and New York papers furnish us with the particulars of one of those thrilling occurrences, which generally leave an impression on the mind. On the night of the 18th ult., a boat containing three men (said to be asleep) got adrift just above the frighful cataract of Niagara. It was soon upset by the current, and two of the men were immediately hurled on to death. Not so the third ; he succeeded in reaching a stump or log of wood, which, in its previous course downward, had become wedged tight between the rocks, whose surface projected above the rapid current. Here, just on the verge of the foaming cataract, with the Voted, Whereas an enlarged circulation of the waters rushing wildly past him, at the speed of forty miles an hour-with thousands of his fellow beings gazing on him, in his awful resting place, without means to relieve him-though not without and clung for twenty-hours to a slippery rock which itself could scarcely withstand the force of the stream. During this awful period, every scheme that human ingenuity could invent was resorted to, by the thousands who were witnessing his perilous situation, in order to his rescue. But all in vain. At last he succeeded in placing himself upon a raft which had been floated to him, with the expectation of being drawn again to the shore. The ropes which held this became tangled in the rocks and could not be extricated. A life boat was then sent out, but the violence with which it came in contact with the raft, precipitated the unfortunate man into
