When to Stop.

The other day, in company with a friend, I started to make a visit to Somerville, a few miles from Boston. Never having been there, we waited for the conductor to announce the station. Bristly engaged in conversation, we were whirled on past one or two stations, and we began to think it was time to inquire for Somerville. "How far are we from Somerville, Sir?" asked of a gentleman. "Some distance now, Sir," was the reply. "What are we past it, then?" "O, yes," said he, "it was the last place we stopped at." I did not run and shout to the conductor to stop the car, but I felt very much like it. "Did you want to stop there?" inquired he. "Yes, Sir, I intended to, but I will go on now to the next station." He might have replied, and I suppose he thought, "you must go on now, whether you will or not."

This incident led me to reflect, how important it is to know "when to stop." We sometimes hardly know when to begin, and to know when to stop, is quite an important matter.

Young man, if you are just commencing or practicing any vice or bad habit, the time to stop is now. You have arrived at a stopping place, and you may stop now, if you please, but if you suffer yourself to be whirled on by appetites and passions, you may get so far, that when you desire to stop, it may be out of your power to do so.

If you swear, or drink, or break the Sabbath, "stop now." If you think evil thoughts, or tell things not quite true, "stop now." If you are going to a dance, or a play, or any place where you may meet bad company, "stop now." If you are in the habit of joking about religion, or ministers, or preaching, "stop now." If you think there is time enough to become religious by-and-by, and that you will pursue the way you are going awhile longer, "stop now," for the course you are going leads to death.

Or, Experience of a Boy who died, aged 8 Years and 3 Months.

I cannot tell you about this boy's childhood, any further than that he was born at Brighton, in 1767. You know Brighton is a favorite place now with great people, because of its fine situation near the sea, and its fine climate. The Queen has a palace there. At the time we speak of, when Robert Rogers was born, it was not so famous, but a great deal of good had been done in it; and it was called Brighton-belle.

This little boy would often say, "What is this world when compared with a Soul?" He once heard of a man who sold a leaf of the Bible for a man of law, and expressed his horror at the man's conduct: "for (said he), the Bible is worth all the world, because it is God's Word."

At the time when he first discovered the way of salvation, he was very fond of British air. "O Lord," I will praise thee: though thou wast angry with me, thine anger is turned away, and thou hast comforted me." He was also very fond of the 23rd Psalm: "For now he knew the Lord Jehovah was his Shepherd. There are not very many boys or girls who really know that, though they all know how to repeat the words of that Psalm. My dear young friends, let me ask you. Do you know who is your Shepherd? Would He be with you in the dark valley of death. He loved the Lord's day. Speaking of it, he said, "God has commanded us on that day not to think our own thoughts, nor speak our own words, but I have done both." Yet the Lord has forgiven me that sin also. And much did he love John xx. 1, where we are told so simply, "The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene, early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and sought the same taken away from the sepulchre." Do

you not like, dear reader, to hear of places in places of the Scripture which souls seek out of glory used to delight in? I think it is very interesting to know of such persons; and when we read them, and polish them too, we are going our way by the footsteps of the flock.

In the year 1775, April 16th, he looked upon some friends beside him with a remarkable sweetness of countenance, and said, "I find we must have a better righteousness than our own. I have often thought, when I heard preaching at the chapel, 'How good I will be: I will never play with naughty boys!' but as soon as the next day came, I was as bad as ever. So I am sure our righteousness will never do." This little boy was glad to take Christ's righteousness to cover his guilty soul. Christ was his Saviour; he needed His righteousness, and felt he needed it to be the very last. For when some friends were one evening telling him that his minister, Mr. Peckwell, had prayed much and kindly for him in the church, Robert replied, "And the Lord has answered his prayers. But he must pray again, for I am very proud: I was so proud when I had my last new clothes, that, if I should live, I shall be afraid to wear them again. But the Lord loves me, and has pardoned that sin too." You see how a sense of God's love in pardoning him, and giving him a better righteousness than his own, made him all the more hate his sins, and be jealous of his proud heart.

He loved his parents, according as the fifth commandment enjoins. Seeing his mother shedding tears when he was ill, he asked her to try not to grieve: "I can tell you of one who had a greater trial than you, namely, Abraham, when he was to offer up his son." His mother answered, "True, my dear, but I have not Abraham's faith;" and he rejoined, "God can give it you. I long to die and go to the Lord." She continued to grieve, and said, "I cannot give you up; I hope the Lord will spare you. Can you wish to leave your afflicted father and me?" His reply was a kind but very decided one: "I had rather die; for now I have two fathers, one in heaven, and one on earth (pointing to his earthly father). Then he looked at his father steadfastly, saying, "I know that the Lord loves you;" and added, "but I had rather die."

On April 17th he was heard at times repeating, "The Lord loves me! the Lord loves me!" Is not this a blessing, dear children, far beyond all other blessings? To be loved of the Lord! to be loved with everlasting love? I think I hear you say, "O yes, it is;—but how can I ever reach this blessedness?" You find it written in Prov. viii. 17, "I love them that love me," which means, that whosoever our souls take delight in the Lord Jesus, who "once suffered for sins," then we have a token that He has loved us.

"I should be glad to go once more to the church, for I should sing louder than any person in it," was another saying of Robert Rogers at this time, when feeling how much God has done for his soul. O that all children sang with something of this feeling when they join with the congregation in the psalm or hymn. That same day, at evening, he looked toward the window. "What is that, mother?" It was a dark cloud in the sky, and his mother told him so, adding, "the time will come when the sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood," namely, at the last day. "I know that," said he, "but am not afraid of it now; for the Lord loves me, and will save me, and put me at his right hand."

Young reader, will you have confidence, and not be ashamed before the Lord at his coming? Are you in Him, and do you abide in Him, as the Israelites were in the chamber, on the door of which the blood of the Paschal lamb was sprinkled? If you are, then you shall not need to cry to the rocks and mountains to fall on you on that solemn day, but shall lift up your heads with joy, because your God and Saviour has come.

Varieties.

ABOLITION OF BARBERS' PRACTICES IN INDIA.—An order has just been promulgated by the Magistrate of Poona, under instruction from Government, prohibiting book-throwing and other barbarous practices throughout the Poona Zillah. Such a measure has long been desired by all who wish for the improvement of the natives. Of old it was believed,—and is now— that it was dangerous to meddle with any native practice, however immoral or revolting, that was connected or claimed the sanction of religion. But times are changed, and innovation which might not have safely been attempted a century or half a century ago, the age is now ripe for. Since has long been suppressed. Female infanticide is no less strictly prohibited, and Government sees its way to the abolition of book-throwing at fairs or religious festivals. It has not acted hastily, or without making inquiries as to the extent to which the practice is carried on, and the light in which it was regarded by the enlightened portion of the community. On the latter point, the information received is stated to have been highly satisfactory.

Another barbarous custom also prevalent at Jeypore is interfered by the proclamation of Mr. Davidson. A man runs a sword through the fleshy part of his leg for about a foot, and drawing it out, sprinkles the entrance of the temple. For this feat he receives large fees, and offerings, and the right to perform is venerated, as a valuable privilege, in a body of about fifteen families, to each individual of which is assigned a round on about six or seven years. These men, however, long ago declared, that they would be glad to discontinue the practice (which Mr. Mitchell thinks is a remnant of the rite of human sacrifice) if their incomes could be assured to them.

THE CHURCH OF ROME IN MEXICO.—The Church is a thing of the past here. It may gain strength again if it may rule again, it may tyrannize and lay prostrate the works of progressive civilization, but in its fast preponderant form it is dead unto mortification: still pursuing its way to the life of the future. It will pass away, and the prosperous growth of intelligence will make green and fertile the barren heathens on which nothing but desolation has remained for centuries. The life of Church tyranny is near at an end, if indeed it has not

ended, and the fabled stories which have held the human mind prostrate, must pass as the follies of other ages. The questions of religion and the future are the only ones that can reasonably be raised against the Constitution of 1824. It seems wonderful that so much good should have been secured and still that the most ultra retrogressive provisions should have been laid down in it.—*Mexican Extraordinary*, Oct. 15.

Five young men in Portland have just been sentenced to one, three, five and seven years in the State Prison for incendiarism. They were all smart looking young men, and were well qualified, by ability, to make their mark in society, as good and useful citizens.
