

Three Days later from England.  
Arrival of the Canada at Halifax.

The Canada, Capt. Lang, from Liverpool, noon 14th, arrived at Halifax 9:30 p.m., on Tuesday, 24th.

Among the passengers is Major General Sir W. Fenwick Williams, K. C. B., on a visit to his native province, Nova Scotia. He was received with demonstrations of intense delight; the wharves and streets were crowded with people cheering enthusiastically, and eager to obtain a sight of the world-renowned hero of Kars. The Canada reports on the 15th, 10 p.m., passed steamship America, from New York. Screw steamer Alps sailed the same day as Canada, for New York direct. On the departure of Anglo-Saxon, the Kangaroo was erroneously reported off Liverpool; she did not arrive there until 10 a.m., the 12th. The North Star arrived at Southampton on the 17th.

**RUSSIA.**—A despatch says, that the reported restoration of Sebasopolis is untrue. It remains exactly as the allies left it, with the addition of consequent decay occasioned by neglect. The American Company which undertook to raise ships has failed. They raised one Turkish steamer, which was rotten. Russian ships being of green wood are probably in the same state, their masts are gradually disappearing. Letters from Warsaw say, a religious reform has taken place in Russia. The government has limited the powers of the Orthodox Greek Clergy in certain matters, and has abolished some ridiculous ceremonies which had been introduced into public worship.

**TURKEY.**—The late collisions in Bosna,

in Turkish Croatia and Montenegro, have caused a sort of panic in the Capital; Mussulmans and Christians were living in mutual fear of one another. The Sultan, to show his own confidence, had gone in the fleet on an excursion to Smyrna and the Archipelago. A plot having for its object the massacre of Christians, has been discovered at Smyrna. The Governor made seizure of arms and sent guilty persons to Constantinople. It is reported that on the 28th ult., a band of Montenegrins, 1000 strong, assailed Koschack and killed nearly 1000 inhabitants, who, confounding in armis, were unarmed.—Montenegro burnt many houses and carried many women and children into captivity.

**INDIA AND CHINA.**—Details of Caucis mail, July 4th, add nothing important to telegraphic despatches. The negotiations with new Chinese Commissioner were proceeding at Tientsin, and an interview was to take place on the 7th of June, which would decide whether Chinese Government would yield to demands of England and France, or force them to continue the war. The London Post Paris correspondent writes, that official despatches had reached Paris from which it is concluded that the Chinese Government desires peace. When the despatched left it was expected that terms of peace would be offered, accompanied with permission to establish embassies at Pekin, representing England and France.
