

The tax upon printed books to which I referred in my last has been struck out, probably because of its unpopularity, but that on paper remains, and printers are complaining loudly. The paper used in Canada is chiefly of home manufacture, however, and the only danger to be apprehended is from a combination of manufacturers. Their number being few such a combination might be easily effected; but could not endure very long. Perhaps the alarm is more imaginary than real.

The reader of the opposition press meets with a great deal about one M. Baley whose drafts upon the public chest have been honored to an immense extent, and against whom an outcry has been made for years, and not without cause. The Committee now engaged in overhauling the public accounts has been dealing with M. Baley's, and some facts of a most shameful sort have been brought to light. Among other services rendered, this gentleman has had the construction of four lighthouses on his hands, and some profits have accrued from them. The work was not put up to public competition, neither was a contract made between the Government and the fortunate builder, but he received ten per cent on all money expended. In the accounts presented, it is strange to say, paid without the production of vouchers, M. Baley has charged for mechanics \$3 per day and for laborers \$2. Every thing else in the same proportion. Query. Did the workmen get such liberal wages? But the most curious charge is yet to be named. M. Baley has been charged with the towing of vessels in the Gulf, and these were employed in conveying the workmen and machinery to the lighthouses. For this service alone he has charged \$4000 for each vessel; for \$2000 more than I have stated. Is it any wonder that the country is indignant?

The government officers are to lose ten per cent on their salaries. The ministers have deducted from their own twenty per cent. This leaves for each minister \$4000 a year. The saving thus effected is not regarded as of any moment, the amount being only \$24,000, it is said. Even that is something, although comparatively not worth noticing. The reduction of the number of clerks in public offices is called for. They are increased at home instead, so that the \$24,000 will be allowed up in that way—a poor reduction truly!

A recent attempt to get up a public meeting in Toronto for the purpose of expressing public sentiment in relation to the Government, and the present state of the Country, was a failure. The rowdies took possession, and had their own way, the speaking being drowned by noise. It is not difficult to pack a public meeting in a large city, and such modes of expressing public opinion, if by the phrase be meant the opinion of the respectability of a community, are very imperfect and unsatisfactory.

Representation by population has been up for discussion, and only ten Upper Canada members voted against the measure, while Lower Canada voted the other way. Some conversation about a Federal Union took place; but this does not meet with favor in this part of the country. Most persons think it may be of advantage at some distant day as preparatory to independence and distinct nationality; but that the provinces are not yet for the measure. One legislature for the whole of the Provinces would never accomplish its work satisfactorily in my judgment. Local affairs must be managed locally. Perhaps a union after the model of the United States would be of much benefit to us, any thing else is chimerical.

The Atlantic Telegraph.

By the steamship "North Star," which arrived at New York from Southampton on Tuesday we have intelligence of the failure to lay the Atlantic Telegraph Cable.

Previous news received by the ship "Alice Munroe," at Boston on the 16th, had prepared the public mind for this result.

From the meagre accounts that have reached us we learn that after experiencing very heavy weather the fleet arrived at the point where it was proposed to commence operations on the 26th. The ends of the wire being then joined, the ships sailed, the "Agamemnon" eastward, and the "Niagara" westward. They had hardly got under weigh when the cable snapped; a new splice was immediately made, and the expedition again started. All went on well until noon of the 27th, when after paying out about forty miles, the electricians on board the ships discovered that the current had failed, the cable having again parted.

The vessels were immediately put about, and returned to the starting point. A junction was again effected, and a third attempt made. One hundred and fifty miles had been submerged in good style, when from some cause not yet explained, the cable broke!

The fleet then sailed for Queenstown, which place the "Niagara" reached on the 4th July; the "Agamemnon" not having made her appearance up to the time of the sailing of the "North Star."

We give below a statement of the mate of the "Alice Munroe" which we take from the Boston "Courier" of Saturday 17th, but would not advise our readers to place too much dependence upon that part of it which refers to the unfriendliness of the "Agamemnon" for this service. The Anti-British tendencies of the "Courier" are notorious.

Notwithstanding the many reverses with which this enterprise has met, we understand that its managers are not at all discouraged and that another attempt will be made to unite the old and new world, about the end of the present or the beginning of the next month. We wish them success. The following is the extract referred to—

"They stated that both vessels, the Niagara and Agamemnon, experienced the most violent squalls by gales from the day they left Plymouth, and were driven as far north as latitude 54—much higher than the rendezvous—thus delaying their operations for several days. The Niagara behaved in all respects like a thorough sea-going vessel, and was none the worse for the storm. The Agamemnon, on the contrary, suffered severely. At one time the commander of the Agamemnon informed his first officer that they might as well prepare for a watery grave—he had no hopes of saving his vessel two hours longer to great was her straining. But the storm subsided at last, and the Agamemnon rode out the gale. A most unfortunate accident occurred on board, however, caused by the breaking loose of the 'cone' which held the cable in its position in the gun deck. The cable got adrift, and was pitched about the deck, undoubtedly much to its damage. Two hundred tons of cable also got adrift on the same deck, and caused infinite trouble. Two seamen were injured by

these accidents, one of them having an arm broken, and the other having a leg broken.

The two vessels and their tenders finally arrived on the ground, and on the morning of the 26th a connection of the cable was effected, the weather being then sufficiently calm. The paying out of the cable had scarcely commenced before the wire snapped. After a few hours, detention another splice was made, and the steamers started, the Agamemnon and her consort for Ireland, and the Niagara and her companion for the American coast. Signals were kept up between the two fleets constantly, a message being transmitted every fifteen minutes; and all was going on well till about forty miles had been paid out, when the electricians on board the Niagara discovered that the current was broken. This was at half-past twelve A.M. of the 27th. The Niagara was immediately put about and she had already reached the mid-ocean rendezvous at eight o'clock, when first seen by the Alice Munroe.

It was believed on board the Niagara that the cause of the second breaking was a kink in the Agamemnon's wire, caused by its disarrangement during the gale; but of this there is no certainty. Nothing was said to Mr. Richards about the working of the new 'breakers,' probably there had been no occasion to put them in use. Mr. Field could not conceal his evident disappointment; he certainly had occasion for much foreboding. The theory that June was the most propitious month to carry out the enterprise, was entirely destroyed; the vaunting boasts of the London Times as to the superior capacities of the Agamemnon, was put to rest by the narrow escape of that vessel from going to pieces without the aid of rocks or icebergs; and the two breakings of the wire at the very beginning of the trial—these were certainly enough to dismay the stoutest confidence.

The Alice Munroe parted from the company at the Niagara shortly after noon of the 27th, and left sight of her about four o'clock. The Agamemnon had not then come in sight. The Niagara had hoped that her consort would arrive in season to make another trial that day; but as the weather was foggy, though calm, it is hardly probable that anything was done on the 27th. For two days subsequently the weather was quite calm and favorable, but after that there was another accession of heavy southerly gales, and the weather on the Banks, as experienced by the Alice Munroe, was exceedingly rough.

English News!

The steamer Canada with Liverpool dates to the 31st inst., did not arrive at Halifax until Friday morning the 16th inst, being detained 55 hours outside the harbour by a dense fog.

The future government of India is the important subject occupying the attention of the Cabinet and country during the present session of the parliament. After a number of resolutions had been before the Commons which had drawn out the general views of the members, a Bill was introduced by the Government and passed a second reading on the 24th ult. The principles of this measure may be learned from the following remarks made by Lord Stanley:—

The government of India should be transferred to the Crown that the administration of Indian affairs should be by a responsible Minister, and that this Minister should be assisted by a Council, had been already sanctioned by the House. He then proceeded to justify the proposed constitution of the Council, the number of fifteen, the members to hold office for life, the mode of their appointment, seven to be elected by the Court of Directors of the East India Company from among persons who were or had been of their own body, the other eight to be nominated by Her Majesty, and the manner in which vacancies were to be filled up. The salaries of the members of Council it was proposed to fix at £1,200 a year, with retiring pensions upon a large and liberal scale, of 5000, after ten years' service, and 8000, after a service of fifteen years. He explained the duties and procedure of the Council, adding that he should propose in the committee a proviso (not in the bill) that the Council should meet once a week. He stated what were the powers, and what was the moral influence with which it was desired to clothe the Council, and with respect to matters requiring secrecy the Minister would have the option of creating a secret committee. As to the finances, it appeared to the Government that the machinery contained in Lord Palmerston's bill was totally inadequate and illusory, and that the object would be better attained by regular and political Indian accounts being laid before the House. With regard to the army, it was proposed that the scientific department should be open to competition; that one-tenth of the other cadets should be given to the sons of Indian civil or military servants, and the remainder disposed of according to the existing system, it being the object of the Government to disturb as little as possible the present state of things. The 29th clause in the bill, empowering the Governor-general to appoint Lieutenant-Governors, the Government proposed to submit to full and free discussion in the Committee, holding themselves at liberty to abandon it. There was a provision in the bill for sending out to India a commission to inquire into its finances. This clause he proposed to withdraw, it being intended to settle in communication with the Indian Government the best method of attaining the same end.

On the 2nd in the Lords, the bill for abolishing church rates was taken up by Lord Derby and was opposed and rejected by 150 majority.

In the Commons further progress was made on the Government India Bill.

Attention was called to the fact that the Peruvian government was selling Guano to the Americans at a lower price than to the English. The government replied that Peru had promised to reduce the price to the English standard.

It was thought that Parliament would be prorogued before the end of July.

The British revenue returns for the year ending 30th June, show a decrease of five millions sterling, nearly all of which was occasioned by the reduction in the income tax.

The judicial committee of Privy Council in the appeal against the decision which held the steamer North American liable for damages in her collision with the American ship Lendard, had affirmed the judgment of the Lower Court.

FRANCE.

The Paris correspondent of the Daily News, says the affairs of the Montenegro and the ticklish state of the diplomatic relations

between France Turkey and Austria are considered very serious. That France had sent an ultimatum to Turkey, and that if a satisfactory answer should not be returned at once, more ships will be sent to the Adriatic. The Montenegro publishes a decree reappointing M. de Moiney President of the Corps Legislatif, and a special session of legislature was anticipated. Advances from Lyons report a decided improvement in commercial affairs; improvement was also observable in a less degree at Marseilles. The Montenegro contains a decree which continues the law of June 1863, forbidding Corsicans to carry arms till June 1863. Several districts in France are suffering severely from a great want of water; in Paris it is used very sparingly by the lower classes. The Patrie says the Russian frigates have joined the French squadron in the Adriatic, and has been placed under the orders of the French Admiral. This news created great sensation at Vienna.

PARIS, Friday.—The three per cent's closed at 68-15.

It is said that 126,000 soldiers will assemble in the Camp of Powonski, near Warsaw, at the end of August, for inspection by the Czar.

Cholera had made its appearance at St. Petersburg.

A fire had almost entirely destroyed the shipping at Helsingfors.

It is announced that the Turkish Government has made ample satisfaction for the outrage on Fonblanque. The British Consul General states that the regiment to which the soldier who made the attack belonged has been withdrawn, and the soldier and his officers sent to Constantinople for trial. The Pacha personally expressed the regret of the Porte to the Consul, and salutes were fired to honor of the British flag.

It is stated that Faud Pacha has communicated a telegraphic despatch to the Ministers of Foreign Affairs of France, giving fresh assurances that the troops sent to Hersegoria were not intended to act against the Montenegrins; and that in no case should that country be invaded by the Turks.

The Montenegro frontier commission met at Ragusa in the middle of July.
