I would be sorry to learn that I had heen the means of causing any of us to misspend the precious and never to be recailed moments of this Lord's day ; but as it is the last opportunity of the kind with which we expect to be blessed this season, perhaps the very last which some of us may ever enjoy of meeting here or elsewhere for a like purpose, I shall therefore venture to address you at some length on the occasion.

Though my personal acquaintance with sabbath schools is very limited, and my knowledge of their history very imperfect, yet if you will indulge me with your attention a few moments I hope to be able to lay before you a few facts and suggestions relating to Sabbath schools generally and our own particularly, which I trust may prove in some degree acceptable and appropriate.

I am desirous of presenting the topic in a light, which, however faint, may at least be a reflection of the truth. I have not the most distant wish to exaggregate; and without resorting to any such means, I believe it to be quite possible to convince any candid mind that we have just reason from analogy to hope that seed has been here planted through our instrumentality, whose fruit shall yet amply compensate for the time, labour and money expended in the religious instruction of the pupi's of this School.
