**The Woman who Lives Without Eating.**

We have published several notices of Mrs. Hayes, who resides in one of the northeastern counties of this state, and whose extraordinary suffering has attracted the attention of scientific men. The following is written by Rev. S. P. Williams to the Christian Advocate:

"Mrs. Hayes is not yet dead. I have seen her several times. And after reading all that has appeared in the Advocate in regard to her, venture to communicate a few thoughts upon her case.—Before she passed into this peculiar and afflictive condition, her health was for some length of time extremely poor. She ate but little, and that little occasioned considerable amount of suffering. Sometimes it threw her into spasms. For nearly a year before she ceased to take refreshments altogether, she lived wholly or nearly so, upon the juice of (red) raspberries, until that became the source of suffering. Then for a time she took occasionally a small quantity of cold water; and it is now nearly a year since she swallowed any food, to the knowledge of anyone. Indeed, I have no doubt that a teaspoonful of liquid put into her mouth would be the occasion of her death, unless the spasmodic action of her throat should expel it.

When this is over, and the spasm passes off, she struggles for breath, and her head is rolled from side to side almost with the same rapidity as during the moment of the attack.

The face becomes red with rush of blood to the head, and the skin moist with perspiration. Then the spasm subsides into a gentle motion of the jaw, and shoulder-keeping time, as one would think, with the action of the heart. Her skin about the face, neck and hands is as delicate and healthy as the skin of an infant.

The pulsation of her blood about the chest, neck, head, arms, though exceeding

delicate, are quite regular. Her hair does not grow, nor is it worn off her head as it would naturally suppose, except a little on the crown. The action of her liver is entirely suspended, of course. The action and state of the lungs are perfectly healthy. They have been thoroughly examined by skillful physicians with the aid of the stethoscope and are supposed to be perfect.
