ARRIVAL OF THE "NIAGARA."

The Niagara, which left Liverpool on the 11th, arrived at Halifax on Wednesday. The steamer was met by the Customs and Excise officers, and the principal news was received by the telegraph.

BRITAIN.—The Times' city article says the condition of the Atlantic Telegraph is better than it was some time since. Signals continue to be received, but are too uncertain and faint to be intelligible.

The Times' Plymouth correspondent telegraphed on the 9th that instructions had been issued to the Admiralty for suspending the embarkation of the Valencia share of the cable on board the S. S. Bebon, which vessel was en route to receive it.

The Liverpool Post says that the electrical experiments have proved beyond a doubt that the defect in the cable arises from a leakage, at a distance of 240 miles from land.

The British Board of Trade has directed an enquiry into the circumstances attending the wreck of the American ship Abby Langdon, off the Isle of Wight.

The whole of the 5,000 reinforcements of cavalry and infantry recently ordered to India had been dispatched.

The London Gazette contains a notification that the convention was concluded between Great Britain and Brazil, on the 23rd of June last, for the settlement of outstanding claims of subjects of the two countries.

A correspondent of the Times, who has good official experience of Chinese expressions, has strong apprehensions that if the payment of the war indemnity, which is rumored to have been fixed at £3,200,000 for England, and £1,200,000 for France, is allowed to be left dependent on the collection of the customs at Canton, not only will its receipts be problematical, but there will be a constant recurrence of disputes.

The forcible abduction by the Roman Inquisition of a Jewish child, at Bologna, under pretence of its having been secretly baptized by its Catholic nurse, had created a most painful sensation throughout the Jewish world.

FRANCE.—The monthly Bank returns show an increase of cash in hand in Paris of 223 millions francs, and in branch banks of 10 millions.

The Times correspondent is assured that the French Government have decided to apply free trade to Algeria, and that all ports on that coast are to be declared free.

LONDON, Saturday 11th.—The following telegraph was received at the Foreign Office to-day:

Alexandria, Sept. 11th.—The steamer Ottawa arrived at Suez, from Bombay, on the 5th, with Bombay dates to the 19th ult. The steamer Nemis also arrived at Suez, from Calcutta, on the 5th. M. An Sing being besieged in the fortress of Shahwar by a large body of rebels has been relieved by Gen. Brant, whose column is now at Fyzabad, where it has been joined by Manning and his troops.

Gen. Roberts, on having come up with the rebels near Kairah, totally defeated them, capturing four guns. The loss of the enemy in killed was very severe.

Hon. F. Bruce arrived by Nemis and proceeded to Malabar. He is bearer of the treaty with the Chinese plenipotentiaries of the 26th June. It was subsequently forwarded to the Emperor and received his approval. The following are some of the stipulations:

Christianity tolerated throughout the empire, and persons teaching or possessing that religion, whether Protestant or Roman Catholic, to be entitled to the protection of the Chinese Government; diplomatic agents may reside permanently at Peking; British traders protected against excessive transit duties; tariff to be revised, several new ports opened to trade, and the free navigation of the Yangtze-Kiang declared; British subjects may travel for pleasure or trade to all parts of the empire, when provided with passports from British authorities; Government to act in concert for the suppression of piracy; indemnity to be paid the British subjects for losses at Canton.

The Lady Canning arrived at Suez yesterday from Yombu with Moorish Princes who were plighted on their way back from Medina, having heavy ransom to pay for their release.

The Times has received the following telegram from Alexandria, dated the 7th:—The Persa sails to day with the Bombay and Calcutta mails. The dates are from Bombay, Aug. 19th, Calcutta 8th, Ceylon 10, Hong Kong, July 22nd. At Canton disturbances and bloodshed continued. Exchange at Hong Kong 45, 51.

The 100th Regiment, the regiment recently raised in Canada, is expected to be ordered to India soon.

The accumulation of precious metals in the Bank of France is the largest ever known, and upwards of £600,000 in Australian gold is off the coast and will be sent into the Bank.

The Avon has arrived off Parramatta from Melbourne, with 100,000 ounces of gold, worth £488,000. This supply will be sent into the Bank. The £185,900 in Australian gold, by the Hogomet and Perovit, will be delivered on Saturday, and will also be sent into the Bank.

Count Ercoffanni has been arrested at Rome and the Abbe Masi at San Stefano, for having taken a copy of the Italian translation of the Bible to some friends, though without any proselyting purpose.

Lord Derby has given offence to the religious portion of the British people, by his denunciation of the Sabbath, by attending a banquet on Sunday at the residence of the French Ambassador in London.
