The country is deluged with the liquor traffic—the prisons, the asylums, the almshouses are crowded with victims of intemperance. Dens of iniquity—we mean those houses where strong drink is dealt out to the public—next to every town. Every village has its half dozen taverns; every town its scores, and every city its hundreds. Their numbers are increasing at an enormous ratio. What counteracting influence is brought to bear against this source of misery? What efforts are put forth by friends of humanity to stop this stream of blood, which is marked by the blood of victims? In our estimation, we say, the energy displayed by the Christian community is not in proportion to the enormity of the crime. The secular press—that mighty engine for good or evil—recalls the deaths, the accidents, the murders, the suicides, and other fruits of intemperance, without as much as pointing to their cause. It is high time this apathy was forgotten. The results of traffic in intoxicating liquor are too palpably written in the records of crime to be allowed to longer to pass unnoticed. Indifference to the legitimate consequences of habitual drunkenness is incompatible with progressive civilization.—*Canada paper.*
