

EUROPEAN NEWS.

The latest news from England is by the "Europa" at Halifax on Wednesday. She left Liverpool on the 8th. From the telegram to the News Room we select the following important news.

China.
Official correspondence between British Government and its officials in China relative to measures taken for ratification of Treaty at Peking is published.
British Ambassador, states positively that if Admiral Hope had expressed doubts as to the result of attempting to force the passage of Peiho, they would not have been shared by the squadron, and if it be decided that the marine command were insufficient to justify so bold a line of policy, Bruce accepts the responsibility of Admiral Hope's action.

Lord John Russell's reply virtually approves the course taken, and says that preparations are being made in conjunction with the French Government, to enable forces to support Plenipotentiaries in their instructions.

Bruce in one of his letters shows the position occupied by Ward, the American minister, and expresses his opinion that the Chinese will not make any difficulties about exchanging ratifications with him, as the conditions under which the American minister is alone entitled to visit Peking, contains nothing offensive to Chinese friendly feeling and assistance experienced from Mr. Ward and flag-officer Patterson, and concludes as follows, Mr. Ward's position is one of considerable difficulty. Nor do I see after our unsuccessful attempt at the Peiho that any course was open, save the one he has adopted. He has acted cordially and frankly in spirit of his declarations to me at Hong Kong, and it is a matter of satisfaction that his conduct in our previous line of conduct pursued by M. de Bourboulon and myself.

Conflicting rumours are still current as to French preparations against China. Patrie says a special corps of fifteen hundred men is soon to be formed and sent to Egypt, thence to be conveyed in steamers to China.

Italy.

Nothing further as to the proceedings at Zurich beyond general assertion that progress continued to be made towards signing Treaty of Peace. It is said that the treaty will be complicated, and will leave Austria a door open to quarrel with Piedmont.

The Paris Constitution contains an article by its chief Editor, in which he states that the preliminaries at Villafranca had rescued Italy from every foreign intervention, no matter under what name or from what Power it might come. France confides herself to giving the Italians proper advice which, if followed by them, would have insured the prosperity of Central Italy, but having in vain offered advice she cannot go so far as to dictate orders to Italy.

Latest reports say, that the treaty between France and Austria will probably be signed at Zurich 10th or 12th inst. Austria is said to have consented to sign on all questions, belonging to Lombardy.

A telegram from Modena to the Daily News says, on the 5th Colonel Anviti, late President of the military Commission of the Ex Duke Parma, was discovered to have arrived at Parma in disguise, having gone there to get up a conspiracy, he remained concealed for some time, and when recognized by the populace, great efforts were made to save him, he finally took refuge in the guard house where four or five carabinieri were stationed, but the door was forced and Col. Anviti was killed. Perfect tranquility subsequently prevailed.

Daily News says that Anviti was one of the most detected men in late Government, and in reign of Regent narrowly escaped the vengeance of his countrymen. Another version says he was merely passing through the city, and was recognized at the Railroad station; he was dragged through the streets, buffeted by the people, and finally his head was cut off and carried in triumph. Troops reached the scene too late to prevent.

Vague report that Prince Carignano had been tendered and had accepted the Regency of Central Italy for King of Sardinia.

It is confirmed that Sardinian Ambassador to Rome had received his passport. Gravity of proceeding is diminished by circumstance that diplomatic relations between the two Governments have been interrupted ever since the Sardinian Chambers passed the famous law relative to Convents.

Government of Bologna decreed the abolition of Customs line on frontiers of Modena and Tuscany, and the adoption of the Sardinian Customs Tariff.

Mazzini addressed a letter to King of Sardinia, frankly renouncing his personal opinion and promising support of Democratic party, if the King can and will make Italy free.

Nepes letters say that great agitation continued to prevail there. Fourteen persons belonging to the highest families had been arrested—among them Baron Gallucci, Marquis Daffio and Marquis Garraio. They are accused of holding republican views on the discussion of politics. Government was taking active precautionary measures against outbreak.

Reported that Garibaldi had entered the Marche, and the rumour caused much sensation in Naples.

Latest—Letters say parties above referred to as under arrest had been released without prosecution.

It is said that the Pope has informed the Great Powers that he will not give up his temporal powers, and will, if necessary, call upon all Catholic powers to support him.

Great Eastern.

France.

The London Herald's Paris Correspondent says, it is strictly true that Napoleon has a secret understanding both with Austria and Sardinia, which will enable him to command the whole Italian Sea-board of Mediterranean, as far as Civita Vecchia, and another step in furtherance of the scheme is the expedition to Morocco, as the Mediterranean Squadron which had sailed from Toulon with 10,000 men for Morocco frontiers will command the African Coast from Algiers to Clinta.

Times Correspondent is assured that the number of steel plated frigates yet ordered is six, and that twenty large transports capable of carrying fifteen hundred men each are building or ordered.
