From these facts, then, it will be seen the loss of Sicily is a heavy blow to Naples, and that if added to Sardiania, it will be one of the brightest jewels in the crown of the Soldier-King. This will increase his subjects to 13,000 000, and thus form a powerful kingdom. It is a great achievement to snap the fetters of 2,000,000 of bondsmen, and bring them within the pale of freedom, and greater still to open a highway for the Gospel.
