Speech of the Hon. Charles Fisher.  
BEFORE THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY—ON MR. TIBBETT'S MOTION.

The ATTORNEY GENERAL said that the Provincial Secretary had referred to the observation he made the other day, as to the character of the resolution, and attempted to prove from the motion made by him in 1854, that it was necessarily a vote of no confidence. What he, the Atty. Gen., said, was, that the character of the resolution moved, or its adoption or rejection was of no importance to the country. What the country required was a thorough discussion of the subject. He had no desire to vote upon any specific proposition, but he would not shrink from giving such a vote as his own self-respect demands irrespective of party. It certainly was not a usual to discuss a vote of no confidence in committee. If the Government preferred making it a vote of no confidence they could do so, though a vote of censure did not of necessity imply that. Two years since the present Postmaster General moved a vote of censure upon the question of despatches, the Government treated it as a vote of no confidence. If the present resolution had been moved in the early part of the session and passed, and the Government would not accept it as a vote of no confidence, it would have required another resolution and address to the Governor to have effect, and upon the motion to address the Governor the whole might be made. In 1854 his motion, though somewhat similar in terms to the present, was directly addressed to the Governor, being in amendment to the answer to the speech made at the opening of the session, and covering the whole period of four years administration, and was brought forward expressly as a motion of no confidence and so debated. The whole of the land question had been greatly magnified; there was really nothing in it—it was a stupendous bubble, and had been go up for political and party purposes. The Government had invested it with a degree of importance in their controversy with him.—Had they acted like men and not cowards, the whole world have blown over, as it was best a pie of political clap trap. The Provincial Secretary had argued the question as if there were some wrong in a member of the Government or of the Legislature, purchasing Crown Lands; nothing was more delusive, and no such idea should be permitted to go to the country. There was no law, nor rule, nor principle established to prevent members of the Government or of the Legislature buying land, and when men become members of Government, they surely did not lose their rights of citizenship. The public mind should be thoroughly disengaged on this point—once establish that as a rule, and they would proscribe the whole mercantile and lumbering classes; the best business men, and those most acquainted with the trade and commerce of the Province, would be excluded from the councils of the country. If the Committee recommended anything of the kind, he did not agree with them. Mr. Conard, when a member of the Government, at one time held 1110 miles of timber land, and Mr. Rankin about 666, making 1774 miles in the whole. The real speculations was at the annual sales of the timber land. The use of fictitious names so much talked of had existed for twenty-five years, through various administrations. He, the Attorney General, never knew its existence in any degree until late in 1859, and had no idea of the extent of the system till the recent investigations. He had never given the business of the Crown Land Office, nor the regulations, much attention, and knew very little about them.—With regard to Mr. Inches, he did not agree that he had given his evidence fairly, as he had endeavored to magnify one class of men and detract from another, and really appeared to have charge of the committee, and more like an accuser than a witness, and he colored many things during the time he was present.—He (the Attorney General) had not read the evidence or paid any attention to it, after he gave his own testimony. He had intended to explain some matters, and answer some other statement; but as judgment had been passed upon him, he concluded to give himself no more trouble about it, believing that so far as the country was concerned, it would make very little difference. He had differed from the Government as to the mode of dealing with Mr. Inches, and nothing had occurred to change his mind. His opinion was that he should not have been suspended, pending the investigation, and he assigned the reason at the time that the result of the enquiry would determine whether he should be retained or discharged, and I would throw the responsibility from the government upon committee. There was a remark of Mr. Inches who would refer to him. He had excused himself for his excessive purchases, by assigning as a reason that members of the government had been concerned in similar speculations. It appeared from the Report of the Committee that the bulk of his purchases had been made from land obtained in the names of other parties in the years 1853 and 1854, before he (the Atty. Gen.) and his late colleagues had any Executive existence. This is the result of his own testimony. This whole complaint of land jobbing and speculations was very extraordinary to him. There had really been no unusual speculation during the last four years, but suppose there had, the money had gone into the Revenue, and the Country had received the benefit of it. Selling the land was more beneficial to the Revenue than retaining it. The better price of a mile of land would produce an annual interest in perpetuity of £4 10s. whilst the same land held by the Crown, at the further cost, would only bring some £6 a year for a limited period. New light appeared to have broken in upon them all at once, for he remembered on various occasions that the disputes between the Surveyor General and the late member for St. John, who had been Surveyor General, upon the subject of the revenue derived from sales of lands and timber, each contending for the amount he had collected in his own time, as proof of good management, and the prosperity of the country, but now it appears the better system is not to sell the land at all. He, the Attorney General, was convinced that no month it could be devised to stop speculation, but the imposing a tax upon unimproved lands. It was a devious to suppose there had been any unusual speculations during the last few years, contrast the condition of things now, with what it was in time

past. In 1846 there were 834,658 acres of land reserved for mills alone, and in 1858 when the system was broken up by the present party, there were 312 miles of mill-reserve producing only £215 per year. He had noticed during the progress of the investigation of the committee, the conduct of some persons when the evidence disclosed anything that might be unfavorable to the party in the ascendancy. In a few years during the good old times, 22,000 acres of land were given to eleven councillors for their services, and the 1st grant issued in 1845 to Captain Hurd, and it would be difficult to find what services he had rendered the country, to entitle him to 2000 acres of land. Between April 1833, and December 1845, thirty-five thousand acres had been given to 35 half-pay officers of the Army and Navy, besides several grants made since, to gentlemen whose names were not in the list before him. There was no class of men actuated by higher principles of honor than officers of the Army and Navy, and yet nearly the whole of this large quantity of land, if not the whole, had been granted in violation of the regulations. Before grants could issue it was necessary to prove to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that the applicant intended to settle on the lot granted, it would seriously affect the value of all the land through seven counties.
