MR. BOYD'S LECTURE.—Mr. Boyd re-delivered his popular lecture on 'Go! while you're young,' for the benefit of the Ragged School Society.—There was a very respectable audience. Judge Parker presided.

From a late number of the "Montreal Witness"
we copy the following:

THE PUBLIC WOE VS. THE PUBLIC WEAL.
The present is, in an important sense, the most melancholy season of the year for this city. It is in this month that our civic rulers raise the flood-gates of the liquor traffic to allow a deluging and deadly stream to pour over every part of the city for a year to come. It is now that, in company with more respectable applicants, the keepers of gambling-hells, places of seduction, and resorts of thieves and prostitutes, can obtain licenses to sell those intoxicating drinks, without which they could not carry on their nefarious business. It is now that citizens sign petitions for tavern and saloon-keepers, certifying them and their houses to be respectable, when they must, if they know them, be aware that many are the very reverse; and it is now that the police wink hardest at past delinquencies, and say nothing against many applications which they know to be of the very lowest and worst character. Parliament makes laws to permit this deluge of iniquity; the City Government gives effect to these laws, though it is optional with it to refuse to do so. The police are often on good terms with the liquor-sellers, and these latter, having such a respectable combination of authority to sustain them, prey at will on the very virals of the people. All the cases of wretchedness and destitution which occupy the attention of our ministers, missionaries, charitable societies, and benevolent ladies, grow almost without exception out of this liquor-traffic; and the united efforts of all these do not even partially reach a hundredth part of its evil consequences or, generally speaking, accomplish much to remedy what they do reach. There are, including licensed houses of all kinds and unlicensed, some 600 or 700 places for the sale of drink in this city, each attended by two or more persons, many of them laboring day and night to make drunkards; pappers, and disturbers of the peace and what can a handful of ministers and benevolent individuals accomplish to stay or remedy such a torrent of evil? or what can all the efforts of all the temperance organizations accomplish?

It is stated at the public prayer-meetings by city missionaries and others qualified to judge, that intemperance is fearfully on the increase in Montreal, especially among young men; that the scenes of drunkenness, destitution and woe which are found in many parts of the city are truly appalling; that mothers are found drunk, and even little children are seen at times intoxicated; and there appears to be neither alleviation nor remedy for all the crime and wretchedness caused by the liquor-traffic, so long as it goes on. And still on it goes, like the car of Juggernaut, urged forward by the united strength of the great body of society, and like it, crushing victims at every step! If Juggernaut could speak, however, he might well complain of the comparison. Where his car rolls over two or three victims, the liquor-traffic, even in this single city probably, crushes its hundreds. His car only rolls forth to its deadly work once or twice a year; but the wheels of the liquor traffic are rolling, rolling, and crushing, crushing, a constant succession of victims, night and day, all the year round. And yet we pity the poor creature, and vaunt our civilization and Christianity!
