The Duke of Newcastle has resigned, and Cardwell has succeeded to the Colonial Secretaryship. Lord Clarendon has accepted the Chanceryship of the Duchy of Lancaster. France will only ask the inhabitants of the Duchies to declare what Government they prefer, in the event of the greater part of the powers abandoning the treaty of 1861.
