

*Zion's Advocate* says:—Under the evil influence of the President's policy, the Southern States are fast returning to the disloyal feeling and action that existed before the war. In an election for certain State officers, Kentucky elected the rebel candidates recently by a majority of about 30,000. What the feeling is in Louisiana, the recent horrible massacre in New Orleans may testify. The President is ready to aid the pro-slavery party in getting political control of Missouri, over which the Secessionists are exultant.

In Cincinnati and St. Louis the mortality from Cholera has reached as high as 84 deaths per day.

New York, Aug. 28.

General Santa Anna has had Senator Dano lazeur arrested on a charge of fraud in the purchase of the steamship "Georgia." He charges the Senator with having bought him a forged letter from Secretary Seward, urging him to come immediately to the United States as that Government was willing to aid him in behalf of Mexico. The damages are laid at \$70,000.

The correspondence says that the people are suffering in British Honduras from the burden of Government taxes.

New York, Aug. 29th.—The President left Washington yesterday, en route for Chicago. His progress is attended by great ovations.

Boston, Aug. 29th.—Despatches from Leavenworth give further account of Indian murders and depredations on the plains. The Indians' hold the whole country except the Military Camps in the vicinity of Fort Garland.

In Mexico they are engaged in an indiscriminate slaughter of all Mexican residents.

In Northern Texas also robberies and murders are of almost daily occurrence.

OTTAWA, C. W. 29th.—The Rot has attacked the potato crop in Ottawa county, and the oat crop is much damaged by the rain and wind.

Both these products will be scarce the coming winter.
