The crop report of the Department of Agriculture for August and September have just been issued,

The wheat crop is quite a large percentage greater than that of last year. The prospects of the corn crop continue to improve. While a number of States return low estimates, others -particularly the southern States-show a marked improvement over last year.

Rye, barley and oats exhibit no material change from previous reports. Buck wheat shows an average

Potatoes are rotting badly in many of the large potatoe-growing States, and the crop will probably fall below the yield of last year. In a few States the apple crop promises well, but in a majority the crop will be from 10 to 14 per cent.

Hay shows an increase in almost every State, and quite large in many. The average will reach from . 25 to 30 per cent, above the crop of 1866. The wool clip will probably fall from 5 to 10 per Mr. Charles Second, of Sussex, K. C.
