To preserve a bouquet, a correspondent of the Western Rural says: "Sprinkle it lightly with fresh water, and put it in a vase containing soap suds. Each morning take the bouquet out of the suds, and lay it sideways in clean water; keep it there a minute or two, then take it out and sprinkle the flowers lightly by the hand with water. Replace it in the suds, and it will bloom as freshly as when Knollin, Rev. J. M. McLeod, James F. Avery, Esq., M. D. first gathered. Change the suds every three or four days. This method will keep a bouquet bright and beautiful for at least a month."
