THE BOOK IN THE CRADLE.

In 1835 the Bible Society's agent found that Bibles in Holland were very scarce indeed. He was shown a Bible which ten or twelve persons in the village had subscribed for together, and had sent one of their number into Holland to buy it, where it cost forty-two francs.

The following history is given of a solitary Bi-

ble in another village :-At the time now referred to, there was but one Bible in the whole village, for Bibles were not then to be had in the whole country, and any person who wanted one was obliged to go into Holland to buy it, where Bibles were excessively dear. The Bible excited the rage of the Catholic priests; for it was known to them that it existed: but they could never find it, and many a search was made for it throughout the whole village. 
