A REVEREND MURDERER.—The conviction of the Rev. John Selby Watson, of Stockwell, England, for the murder of his wife, Anne Watson, subjects a clergymnn of the Church to the penalty of death by hanging for the crime of deliberately taking away a human life. The deed was committed in the early days of the month of October, 1871. After killing his wife, the murderer placed her dead body in a box made to order, under his direction, "air-tight and water-tight," intending to send it off by rail. The English police were too active for him, however, and he was brought to justice like an ordinary criminal, neither money, friends or position availing him.


