ENGLISH AND FOREIGN.

LONDON. Sept. 29.—Prince Arthur has opened the Bank at London with appropriate ceremonies in the presence of a large concourse. A ball was given at Tower Hall in the evening.

The wife of Prince Bismarck has arrived at Terquay, where she will be joined by her husband.

During a thunder storm yesterday the lightning struck a mill in Lancashire and killed four women. Several other operations were injured.

A meeting in Dublin to protest against the occupation of Rome, advertised some days ago, has been indefinitely postponed.

The elder brother of the Pope is dead.

Spain is reorganizing the army.

Sept. 21.—The Bishops of Lincoln, Ely, and Westminster, and the Church of England, were present at the opening of the old Catholic Congress at Cologne to-day.

The mine owners at Newcastle refused an advance of 15 per cent, in wages on the ground that coal has fallen and further decline is expected.

Don Carlos is said to have written a letter to the Pope promising a speedy renewal of the Carlist insurrection.

Involiability of private property at sea in time of war is one of the subjects of the discussion of the emperors of Berlin and the Premiers of Austria, Russia, and Prussia, seem interested for the final establishment of its principle.

It is reported that Von Arnim has tendered his resignation as Minister of Germany. France, in consequence of unpleasantries he experienced in Parisian society, and it is stated that if Von Arnim's resignation is accepted, the Embassy of France will remain vacant and Germany be represented at Paris only by a Consul.

There was frost in some parts of England last night. It was the first of the season.

The examination of Edmund about developed no case against him and he was discharged to-day.

The anniversary of the occupation of Rome by Italian troops was celebrated yesterday at that city with much enthusiasm. The city was decorated, the pope received visits of condolence from his adherents, and the people, lamenting the misfortunes of the Catholic Church, and the injustice done to it by the Italian Government.

Leading bankers here assert that the cause of advancing the Bank of England rate of discount is to be found in the low rate of sterling exchange at New York.

Prince Oscar, brother of the deceased king, has succeeded to the throne of Sweden and Norway. All dignitaries of state yesterday took the oath of allegiance to him.

LONDON. Sept. 22.—The London Labor League have adopted resolutions approving of the award of the Geneva Tribunal as binding England and Austria together.

At a meeting of the members of the League of St. Sebastian at Dublin yesterday, steps were taken for the formation of an organization to afford material help toward restoring the temporal power of the Pope.

English Jurists recommend a codification of the English law on the same plan used in New York.

A writer in the London *News* has written upon the horrors of a steerage passage in a steamship, and correspondents in other newspapers are demanding immediate reform.

Dr. Sout was chosen President of the Congress of Old Catholics. A committee has been appointed to secure a union of all Christians in the movement.

The Austrian Court will wear mourning for twelve days in memory of the deceased king of Sweden.

Gambetta has decided to take no part in the celebrations of the anniversary of the French Republic.

A telegraph cable is to be laid between Brazil and the Portuguese coast.

LONDON. Sept. 23.—Stearnship *Chiva* from Liverpool, Saturday, for New York, returned, disabled by breaking machinery. Her mails and 70 passengers were transferred to the *Cabotia* which sails to-morrow. The cargo and remaining passengers will be forwarded by the *Russia* later in the week. Snow fell at Sheffield and neighborhood yesterday.

The resignation of Count Von Arnim, Guru an Minister in Paris, is contradicted.

There is a desire to rape in Romania. Ten thousand persons immediately died from it.

The Dutch Government states that it did not prohibit the International Congress at the Hague because its meetings were public.

London, Sept. 24.—The weather throughout England is tempestuous and some damage is done to shipping on the coast.

The advance in the price of coal has caused an increase in the expenses of running the Lancashire cotton mills to such an extent that it has been decided to reduce the number of hours of labor.

The Turkish Ambassador to France died on a railway train while going to the city of Lemberg, Austria.

Gen. Manteuffel, commander of the German troops now in France, and the French authorities have agreed that the evacuation of the department of Maine and Haute Marne commences on the 15th October.

London, Sept. 24.—The funeral ceremonies over King Carl of Sweden were observed in Stockholm to-day.

The jute crop in Eastern Bengal has been greatly damaged by cyclones.

The removal of the Catholic priest Mermilliod from Geneva by the Swiss government has prompted the Bishop of that section to resist the secular power.

Thiers will propose to the Assembly the appointment of a Vice President of the Republic, the creation of the Upper Chamber, and a new Electoral law.

The opinion of Chief Justice Cockburn, disagreeing with the decision of his colleagues in the Geneva tribunal, is published. It makes a pamphlet of two hundred and fifty pages.
