OTTAWA, May 3.-Lord Dufferin on Saturday assented to the bill empowering the Pacific Railway Committee to swear witnesses.

Mr. Holton spoke of the Insolvency Act, and said he would test the House on it. Sir John A. McDonald said he would not oppose the motion.

Mr. Holton made his motion declaring the desirability of continuing the Insolvency Act another year as an amendment to the motion to go into supply. Mr. Blake spoke at length in support of fitting O'Kelly. the motion. Mr. Holton's amendment was carried by a majority of 21.

In consequence of this Sir John has given notice of a bill continuing the present insolvency law till 810n.

OTTAWA, May 5 .- The Pacific Railway Committee yesterday asked power to adjourn to July 2nd. to keep their proceedings secret until reported to the House, and to sit in such places as were found expedient.

The bill to incorporate the Marine Insurance Co. passed.

Mr. Blake moved an address to the Queen praying that Canada shall be asked to consent before any concession to a foreign power of Canadian rights be made in future, and that her Majesty direct steps to be taken for procuring the right to navigate the Columbia river for Canadians. Mr. Blake declared that the navigation of the St. Lawrence river should not have been yielded without the consent of the Parliament of Canada.

Hon. Dr. Tupper made an eloquent reply, severely denouncing the re-opening of questions that have been settled-the awakening of dead assues for the purpose of attacking the Government. The navigation of the Columbia, he went on to argue, already belongs to Canada by virtue of concessions made by the United States to the Hudson Bay Co. The passage of the resolution would throw doubt on our right to the navigation of the river. He moved as an amendment that it is not in the interest of Canada to re-open any of the questions settled by the Treaty of Washington. After an exciting debate McKenzie's resolution was lost-yeas 56; nays 90.
