On looking into the pantry, I discovered on the lower shelf a number of large black ants in a huddle, and a half dozen by themselves, and Landry on the opposite side of the shelf was some sugar which the ants did not seem to notice, which caused me to wonder; the reason however, soon became apparent. A cockroach made his appearance and went for the sugar; and the group of ants went for him, and before he fairly got a taste of the sugar the ants had him down and killed

him in less than a minute; then the six that stood apart from the rest advanced, took up the dead cockroach, and bore him off the field. 
