

France is made subservient to the temporal aims of the Papacy, the peace of Europe will be compromised.

The report that the Pope would hold another consistory next month is erroneous. It was held yesterday, when the final ceremonies of installation of the recently appointed Cardinals were celebrated, and a number of Bishops appointed.

London, Jan. 17.—The extensive flour mills at London, which were totally destroyed by fire last night, lost £250,000. Four hundred hands thrown out.

Jan. 18.—The Pope will hold another Consistory early next month, when he will appoint several additional Cardinals and seventeen foreign Bishops.

PETERSBURG, Jan. 15.—The Prince and Princess of Wales have arrived.

A grande fête will be given at the American Legation in honor of the Duke of Edinburgh's marriage on Monday.

London, Jan. 18.—The threatening air of the North German Gazette last week on the policy of the Emperor, and the Imperial Council, and the recent successes, the Prussians are still reluctant to make a treaty which refrains from insulating the conquered.

MADRID, Jan. 18.—Gen. Domínguez has been appointed commander of the central army operating against Carlist.

Railway viaduct at Toquella fell yesterday, and thirty-three workmen were killed.

The great fire of the newspapers of Madrid has been suspended by Government.

GLASGOW, Jan. 1.—A despatch from London to the effect that the Home Secretary of Dr. Henry James, who has been appointed a serious difference of opinion between Gladstone and Lowe, which will probably result in the resignation of the latter from the Government.

LONDON, Jan. 18.—St. Montague Chalmers, member of Parliament is dead.

Mr. Gladstone is confined to his residence.

A cold grip prevailed around the British coast yesterday.

Ex-President Thiers has been presented with a golden snuff box by the French residents of Paris.

The French Government has received information that nineteen persons were drowned, including the captain and chief engineer.

General G. H. Whalley, M. P., has been written to the papers, stating that statements made by Jean Lure during his examination as a witness for the defendant in the Tichborne case were untrue, and that the confession made by Lure at his subsequent trial, which was made by Lure was obtained by bribery. For this Whalley has been summoned to appear to answer the charge of contempt of court.

UNITED STATES

NEW YORK, Jan. 15.—A fire consumed nearly a dozen stores on Third street, and five stores on a Pizza street in Altoona, Pa., last night.

The steamships *China* and *Colorado* are over due from Hong Kong and Yokohama, and neither has been sighted.

NEW YORK, Jan. 16.—There are many rumors in Washington concerning the next candidate for Chief Justice, but nothing is really known as yet.

A large fire occurred in Brooklyn, N. Y., yesterday, partially burning a number of warehouses on Front street. Loss \$100,000.

The great steamship *Albatross* of S. S. Houghton, adjoining the Tremont street wing of the Parker House, Boston, was burned out to-day. The Hotel escaped.

NEW YORK, Jan. 17.—Teams are crossing the Missouri at Atchison on the ice. The Hudson is full of floating ice, and fast closing up again.

The Great Northern Railroad voted to increase its rate in February semi-annual dividend on stock.

NEW YORK, Jan. 19.—Special from Grand Rapids, Mich., says that a fire broke out there that has done much damage to the city.

Persons passing between France and Italy no longer require passports.

NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—The Spanish iron clad *Albatross* is expected to arrive here, and it is necessary to put her in the dry dock again for repairs.

Panama dates of January 9th state that owing to the invention of T. S. Minster Williamson the anticipated troubles in Costa Rica have been averted.

Peruvian dates, of the 20th of December, say that the President, Olmos, is dying out.

In Chili the Catholics are endeavoring to control the school question. The priests are threatening excommunication by the Pope to legislators not favorable to Catholicism.

There are threatening indications of a general strike of miners throughout the coal regions of Pennsylvania.

The Stanzas Twins died Saturday at their home in North Carolina. Chang was partially paralyzed last fall, since that time he has been fretful, and recently addicted to drinking liquor as a means of alleviating his suffering. He died at the age of 47, and it was believed that Chang was dead, but he was followed by a deadly stroke, two hours from the death of Chang, Jan. 21.

NEW YORK, Jan. 21.—Jesse Gushing has decided to resign his office.

The President has approved the Bill, repealing the Salary Act, except the salaries of the President and Justices of the Supreme Court, thus restoring compensation of members of Congress to former rates.

An investigation into the fatal gas explosion and fire at Bennington, Vt., shows that it was not the result of carelessness. Nine persons were killed and identified. All the wounded, but one, will be recovered.

A fire in Chicago yesterday, involving the burning of the Union Central depot, including a loss of \$80,000. At one time apprehensions for safety of the city were entertained.
