WATCHMAKING IN SWITZERLAND.
[From the Swiss Times of May 20th.]
We have already drawn attention to the annual meeting of the Society of Arts, held on the 23rd current, under the presidency of the Duke of Sutherland, and are now able to furnish some further details.
Professor Steinhilber, in delivering a most interesting report, passed in review the operations of the Industrial society, in reference to Commerce, laying great stress upon the competition that has taken place in the manufacture of chronometers. This competition was instituted with the object of testing the workmanship and precision of chronometers turned out by Geneva manufacturers, and none but those adopted for pocket use were admitted. They were deposited in charge of the authorities at the Observatory, and underwent the most searching official possible to be applied to pocket instruments of this class. The jury specially retained to decide the difficult question as to whom to award the palm of excellence unanimously decided in favor of Meisters of the canton of Geneva. This firm having carried off the sole prize by exhibiting a chronometer which, in addition to the usual excellence of construction required, crowned their first success by gaining honorable mention for two other chronometers. The first of these was made by the celebrated watchmaker, applanse, and Professor Humbert, President of the Alliance des Sciences, from the canton of Geneva, and was distinguished upon subjects connected with his watchmaking.
