

PUBLIC NOTICE.

N and after the 1st of May, the rate on transmittal of newspapers and periodicals in Canada, addressed to the United States, will be one cent the fourteenth of four ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals addressed to the United States, and sent by mail, will be subject to a deficiency at a postage rate of a half cent each, must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals published in Canada, issued at less than one cent per month, and addressed to regular subscribers or new agents in the United States, will be subject to a deficiency at a postage rate of one cent, to be paid in money when mailed at this office, and in advance on newspapers and periodicals not permitted from the Postmaster General, will be allowed on payment on such papers and periodicals, when sent by mail, to regular subscribers in Canada, the United Kingdom and Newfoundland, at the rate of one cent per month, and one cent per copy, when sent by mail, to new agents in Canada, the United Kingdom and Newfoundland. Such papers and periodicals must bear the name of the publisher, and be addressed to him.

On and after the first of October next the prepayment of newspapers posted from offices of publication, will be in cash, and the postage on such papers and periodicals, on St. John, June 20, 1878. (may 6) H. M. M.
