ENGLAND AND FOREIGN

London Sept. 21.—Dissert. In a speech at Aylesbury, yesterday, Dr. Charles E. Woodbury, Physician at McLean Asylum, was killed with a bullet by an ex-soldier whom he was visiting with a game of croquet.

The steamer Hibernia, here for Havana, founded in a gale on the 17th. The crew were rescued. They report the hurricane as fearful.

A special telegram to a New York paper says that Russia is making tremendous preparations for war.

New York, Sept. 27.—Spotted tail and his band of Sioux Indians have made treaty with the United States.

Yellow fever has appeared in New Orleans.

A despatch from Vigo, Spain, says that Tweed was placed on board the U. S. steamer "Franklin" yesterday. He was much surprised when told the "Franklin" was to take him to the United States. He had planned to arrive at Cuba to be safe through the assistance of friends, to avoid being surrendered to American authorities. He expressed great disappointment at the aspect of affairs.

The Times' correspondent says the Powers have asked Turkey to conclude the formal armistice which will probably be conceded to it. Russia is content to establish status quo when war is over.

Sept. 23.—The latest reports from the East are more optimistic than those of previous weeks. The Turks desire that the influx of Russians into Servia during the armistice should cease. The Servian army has become to all intents a Russian army.

The Frankfurter Zeitung says that the Powers will prepare their treaty of peace with Servia, and that the Sultan's liberal policy meets with much opposition.
