THE NEWS AND THE PRESS.

New Brunswick.—Diphtheria prevails in Fredericton, there has been a large number of deaths. Dr. Burnett, of Sussex, held an inquest on the body of Peter Powers, a post mortem showed that deceased came to his death from diphtheria. About a mile of snow fence will be built this fall on the western division of the E. & N. A. Railway. The Dominion Line of Telegraph is open for business at quite a number of points, including Halifax and St. John. It communicates with the direct cable at Glynswor. Work at the new bridge across the Memramouc, has been suspended for the winter. The piers (all but one are completed) are 110x20 feet at the base, 35 feet high, and 20x22 feet at the top. The shore piers rest on piles; the centre ones on solid rock. The approaches are also nearly completed. The lumber for the superstructure is of best white pine, and is at the mill. On Saturday the 27th ult., Mr. David L. Patterson of New Canaan, while returning home after hauling a load of hay to Messrs. E. W. Stockton and L. R. Harrison, who were having a few days sport in the neighborhood, accidentally shot himself with his gun, and he died on the following Monday. The "Gibson Lumber Company" is the name of a new company formed for the purpose of manufacturing lumber of all descriptions. Messrs. John A. Beckwith, E. A. Barton, A. B. Gardner, C. W. McCallan, Harry Beckwith, of Fredericton, Alexander Gibson, of Maryville, and Benjamin Close, of Gibson, have filed the necessary memorandum of association in the office of the Provincial Secretary. The capital stock of the company will be \$200,000, divided into shares of \$500 each, and the principal place of business will be at Gibson's York County. Patrick Kenny of this city, was drowned a few weeks ago at Great Yarmouth, England, from the schooner *Freddie G. Ellett*. He leaves a wife and child living in this city. year. A freight train while backing at Grand Point, on Tuesday morning struck a dead man, Wm. Spencer, who was on the track. A wheel passed over him, he died instantly. John Hamilton, who escaped from Rockwell prison, Halifax, has been recaptured and will have to serve out his original sentence and three months besides. The Yarmouth Herald says:—No doubt the largest trip of fish ever brought to any port in Nova Scotia was lately made, ex. *Cephalo* of Lockport, owned by Messrs. Howard & Austin Locke, of that place, and Capt. James Gayton & Sons, Agents. The *Cephalo*, in charge of Capt. James Gayton, sailed early in the spring of the Grand Bank, and after an absence of about five months (a good portion of this time being spent in procuring fresh bait), returned bringing a cargo of fish which, after being dried very hard weighed 1884 tons. Had these fish been cured as they usually are on our western coast they would have, without any doubt, amounted to 2,000 tons. When we take the very great scarcity of fish and the various other drawbacks to which they were subject into consideration, we may be justified in the conclusion that this is a triumph, if ever, and one which does credit to Capt. Gayton, whose ability and reputation as a fishing master stands second to none. At latest advice the Old Sydney mines were shipping coal to the extent of their capacity to mine and deliver the commodity. Several of the new mines are also fully employed. There are 12 prisoners in the Halifax County Jail and 13 in the County Jail at Sydney. A mysterious explosion occurred in a house on Lockwood street, Halifax, on Thursday. The *Herald* says that the children, four in number, were in a front room of the house with their mother, when a loud explosion occurred, followed immediately by a shower of hot coals from a model parlor stove in which a fire was burning. The ornamental top of the stove was thrown into the middle of the room, one of the doors of the stove was broken, and an investigation revealed the fact that there was a large fire in the back of the stove. One hour and a half after the explosion, the opposite side of the room, fracturing the wall, tearing the plate. The women and children, who were near the window at the time, were not struck at all.
