Ottawa, 1st February, 1877. THE attention of all persons concerned in the Fisheries A carried on inside of the estuary of the River St. John and in that part of the Bay of Fundy around the entrance and in that part of the Bay of Fundy around the entrance to the same, is called to certain provisions of the Dominion Fisheries Act and Fishery Regulations and of the Statute 36 Vic., c. 65, relating to navigable streams and rivers; which statutes prohibit capturing salmon by drift nets;—catching salmon and bass during the close seasons;—destroying the fry of all kinds of fish;—catching fish in nets other fishing apparaius between Saturday nights and Monday mornings ; - and putting mill rubbish or other deleerious substances into the water injurious to the fisheries.

The Fishery Officers are required to enforce these proibitions with renewed vigilance and activity. The penalties provided for infringing these laws consist of fines and forfeitures of the fishing materials illegally used and the fish unlawfully caught or possessed, bought
