It ends with a note on Wednesday morning, March 27th, Joseph H., son of Enoch Saunders, Esq., of Ohio, met with a serious accident, which has resulted in the loss of his left hand. Seeing some ducks fly over and alight in a meadow near his home, he started pursuit. Getting within gunshot of them, he discharged his gun, when lo! it burst, nearly severing his thumb from his hand. The wound was dressed by Dr. Morse, who thought to save the thumb; but it failed to heal, as it should; so on Friday last, it was decided to amputate the hand. A despatch to the Telegraph says, early Sunday morning, that a fire was discovered in the building of Barrington street extension, occupied by Howard C. Evans & Co., general and commission merchants, and owned by Arthur Fordham. Before, however, anything could be got out a rumbling was heard which was followed almost immediately by an explosion. Some fifteen firemen were in the building and all escaped with the exception of Edward Frederick, 3rd officer U. P. Co., 2nd Division, and man named Howell, also a member of the U. P. Co., who were buried in the ruins. Every effort was brought to bear to extricate these men, but nearly three hours elapsed before they could be got out. When found both were in the cellar, Frederick having a heavy box of tobacco on his chest, and was dead. Howell talked to the men working to release him for some time before he was finally rescued. His injuries were comparatively slight, consisting of a broken leg and a few bruises about the head. In the meantime, the flames had spread to the stores at the back, owned and occupied by Mr. Fordham as a leather store. This building was soon completely gutted of its contents, but the fire was yet under control without any further damage. It is supposed to be the work of an incendiary, as Mr. Evans' place was unsuccessfully burglarized on Friday night, and it is thought the would-be burglars were trying their game again, and in some way set fire to the wood-work around. The explosion is said to have been caused by some four or five pounds of powder left there a few days previously. The front of Messrs. Evans' shop was blown into the street. Frederick was a young man and was the only support of a widowed mother, and had carried on business as a druggist on South Brunswick street for some time past. He was to have been married to a young lady of this city next week. The losses were not fully ascertained, but Mr. Fordham lost about \$43,000 on his stock at very least valuation; he was insured in the Royal for \$10,000, North British and Mercantile for \$10,000 and Northern for \$5,000 all on stock, and \$7,000 on both buildings in the Royal. He had just stored some \$5,000 worth of leather in his store. Messrs. Evans were insured in the Guardian for \$3,000, and a similar amount divided between British America and Lancashire on stock. Their loss is fully covered by the above insurance. . . . The number of failures in Nova Scotia for the three months ending on the 1st instant, amounted to 67; with liabilities footin up to \$925,000. The corresponding quarter last year there were 40 failures, with liabilities of \$900,000. . . . Six car loads of fresh meat were shipped on board the "Sandwich" at Halifax on Saturday for England. Mr. Vroom, aged 75 years, and Mrs. Ruggles, widow, aged 72, were married at Cleverton, N. S., on Wednesday last.

The Sackville Borderers say, a case of leprosy came under the hands of Dr. Chandler some time ago. Subsequent to his treatment the patient crossed the Atlantic, with a view of effecting a cure; it is understood that he has returned cured. It is little over an hour after he had swallowed the poison it was found that he had attempted to commit suicide, and Dr. McFarlane was summoned, but when he arrived Gilroy was frothing at the mouth and past human aid. He died about 6 o'clock that night, talking quite sensibly towards the last, but refused to tell the doctor where he obtained the poison. He had been drinking quite heavily of late, and it is thought that while crazed with drink he had taken the fatal drug. He was a married man and has several children living, but they are all married and absent from home. . . . A night train is to be put on between this city and Bangor, soon. . . . The jury strongly censured the indiscriminate sale of poisons to irresponsible persons, and would recommend that in all cases the sale of poisons be withheld, unless on the certificate of a regular medical man. . . .
