A rich lead of copper is said to have been found on the Pugwash River. Another valuable find of copper is also reported in Dorchester Parish on the Grand Anchorage.

Edgar Sykes who created a stir in the dead near business at Halifax a year ago, and has been confined in the jail for debt the last nine months, has been released.

Herring have struck in the bay and harbors of Cape Breton in immense quantities. They are of a superior quality and hundreds of barrels have been sent in nets.

There is a very successful fishery establishing at Sydney, in charge of Mr. Farnsworth. As many as \$350,000 worth of salmon will soon be distributed among the principal rivers of Cape Breton. Next year it is expected that a million small fry will be distributed.

The residence of Mr. J. B. Buckley, at Buckley's Corner, Kings Co., was struck by lightning during the night and was entirely destroyed. Mr. James Caldwell, whose farm is on the north side of South Mountain, had his crops nearly ruined. The hail and rain beat the potatoes and grain flat to the ground, and windows in the house were shattered to stones.

A large barn at Lower Village, owned by Alex. Cutten was destroyed by fire. The origin of the fire was rather singular. A skunk had gone into a barrel of oats stored in the barn, and Mr. Cutten shut him in. The barrel was then taken out and a fire started to get the skunk and oats out again. The barrel was then drenched with water and returned to the barn, but some sparks had been left and these blazed up and set fire to the barn, totally consuming it.

Queen Ann Marsh, Annaberg, Annalonia County is being devastated by army worms. This marsh contains over three hundred acres, and was only recently freed from the ravages of the army worm. They have cut large crops of hay, but this season in it is estimated that at least three hundred tons of hay have been destroyed by the army worm. They are rare visitors in these parts, and are only found upon the marshes, where they lie dead in the ditch banks, "heads and tails" to the water. Last year this worm proved very destructive to the grain crop in Pictou County, but they rarely appear two years in succession at one place.—*Annanalonia Journal*.

The sohr, Pandora, of Yarmouth, N. S., Maurice Forbes, master, arrived at that port Tuesday last, reports having lost in the fog, on the 21st inst., while fishing on Bank Querque, three dozen with six men. Their names were: —David Forbes, Alfred McColl, Sylvain Muir, John Shaw, Philip Hubbard and Joseph Howell. McColl is a native of Dublin County, and the other four natives to Argyle. Capt. Forbes says that, as the weather has been moderate since the second, the missing men have been or will be picked up by some other vessel.

Later—A Yarmouth despatch says: The men lost from the Pandora were rescued by a ship and transferred to another fishing schooner. Two of the men are now at home at Argyle.

#### ENGLISH AND FOREIGN.

LONDON, July 14.—The *News' Alexandria correspondent* says the number of persons massacred by the mob is 2,000.

As despatch to Reuter's Telegraph Co., from Alexandria, says: "Some field pieces were landed with the marines at the Ras El Tin Fort. The Khedive's marines have arrived. A whole battalion of Arabs was blown up in one during the bombardment. The Arab Pasha one of the shells burst in the midst of a crowd of soldiers and killed more than a thousand."

The Daily News' Alexandria despatch says: General Wolsey is expected at Port Said on Sunday. If Arab rebels make a stand there, it will be difficult to move.
